

Entrance Antiphon cf. Ps 138:18, 5-6 I have risen, and I am with you still, alleluia. You have laid your hand upon me, alleluia. Too wonderful for me, this knowledge, alleluia, alleluia. First readina Acts 10:34, 37-43 We have eaten and drunk with him after his resurrection from the dead. **Responsorial Psalm** Ps 117:1-2; 16-17; 22-23 Response: This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad. Second reading Colossians 3: 1-4 Look for the things that are in heaven, where Christ is. Sequence Christians, to the Paschal Victim, offer sacrifice and praise. The sheep are ransomed by the Lamb; and Christ, the undefiled, hath sinners to his Father reconciled. Death with life contended: combat strangely ended! Life's own Champion, slain, yet lives to reign. Tell us, Mary: say what thou didst see upon the way. The tomb the Living did enclose; I saw Christ's glory as he rose! The angels there attesting; shroud with grave-clothes resting. Christ, my hope, has risen: he goes before you into Galilee. That Christ is truly risen from the dead we know. John 20: 1-9

1Cor 5:7-8

It was very early on the first day of the week and still dark, when Mary of Magdala came to the tomb. She saw that the stone had been moved away from the tomb and came running to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one Jesus loved. 'They have taken the Lord out of the tomb' she said 'and we don't know where they have put him.'

So Peter set out with the other disciple to go to the tomb. They ran together, but the other disciple, running faster than Peter, reached the tomb first; he bent down and saw the linen cloths lying on the ground, but did not go in. Simon Peter who was following now came up, went right into the tomb, saw the linen cloths on the ground, and also the cloth that had been over his head; this was not with the linen cloths but rolled up in a place by itself. Then the other disciple who had reached the tomb first also went in; he saw and he believed. Till this moment they had failed to understand the teaching of scripture, that he must rise from the dead.

TWO MINUTE CATECHISM The Easter Triduum

During the Readings, we hear of God's great love for the world, beginning with the story of creation. We hear how God rescued the Jewish people from their slavery in Egypt. Throughout their history the Chosen People were often reminded that they were in a special relationship with God: "You are my people, and I am your God," was the way this special relationship was expressed.

Finally we come to the story of the resurrection itself. Even though Jesus has died on the cross and was buried in the tomb, now he is risen; God has raised him from the dead so that we may all live a new life in Christ.

One of the important parts of the Easter Vigil is the baptism of new members into the Church, these may be adults who have decided to become Catholics, or they may be babies or children of families who are already part of the Church community.

After the newly-baptised adults have been confirmed, the people are invited to renew their baptismal promises. When this is done, the priest sprinkles them with the newly blessed water. The Prayer of the Faithful follows and the Mass continues as usual.

For the fifty days of the Easter Season we commemorate joyfully the resurrection of Jesus from the dead.

Safeguarding Children and **Vulnerable Adults Prevention and** Protection Policy.



In 2014, Archbishop Mark launched the new Safeguarding Children and Vulnerable Adults Prevision and Protection Policy. The central message of the Policy is grounded in the policy statement: The Archdiocese of Brisbane holds that children, young peo-

ple and vulnerable adults are a gift from God with an intrinsic right to dignity of life, respect and security from physical and emotional harm.

They are to be treasured, nurtured and safeguarded by all.

This means that everyone in the church must ensure that the fundamental rights of children, young people and vulnerable adults are respected. This will be achieved through the development of respectful relationships and a commitment to safety, embracing appropriate boundaries, behaviours and practices, in accordance with the Archdiocesan Code of Ethical Behaviour and adherence to legislative imperatives of the State.

To meet this commitment, our parish will be required to fulfil a number of compliance matters. Some of these have already been put in place; however your support is needed to ensure that our Parish meets all requirements of the policy implementation.
