TWO MINUTE CATECHISM

1. What are Angels?
Angels are pure spirits, without bodies, having intelli-
gence and free will.

2. What are good angels; what are bad angels?
The good angels are those who remained faithful to

and were cast into Hell. These are the fallen angels or

**6. What is the sin of Adam and Eve Called? How do we

The sin of Adam and Eve is called, Original Sin.
We all, children of Adam, come into the world with
Original Sin.
It is removed when we are baptized.

**7. When we have Original Sin removed, what effects of
it remain in us?**
The inclination to sin still remains in us because our na-
ture was weakened by the Fall.

I want to take this opportunity to thank the committed pa-
rishioners who financially support our parish every week. As
you can imagine the cost of running and the upkeep of a
parish this size takes a considerable amount and we ask
that you prayerfully consider committing to assist our
planned giving program.

Financial side of our Parish
To help you understand how this works, set out below is a
summary of where the finances are distributed.

At each weekend mass there are two collections.

- All parishes pay 18% of total collections to the Archdio-
cese – this covers the Parish Assessment, Priests Founda-
tion and Clergy Sustentation.
- Balance of the 1st Collection goes to the Order caring
for our parish to assist with the living costs of the Capu-
chin Friars ministering in our parish.
- Balance of the 2nd Collection goes toward covering the
running costs of the parish (e.g. electricity, insurance,
wages of administration staff and maintenance of all
buildings within the parish).

Fundraising

- This is separate from the collections as it is for a specific
purpose (e.g. renovations of the halls).

We have been blessed with generous fundraising which has
initiated the start of renovating our facilities but as you can
see the 2nd collection needs a good boost to keep up with
the demands of looking after a parish of this size and age.
