The teaching of scripture is that he must rise from the dead. It was very early on the first day of the week and still dark, when Mary of Magdala came to the tomb. She saw that the stone had been moved away from the tomb and came running to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one Jesus loved. 'They have taken the Lord out of the tomb' she said 'and we don't know where they have put him.'

So Peter set out with the other disciple to go to the tomb. They ran together, but the other disciple, running faster than Peter, reached the tomb first; he bent down and saw the linen cloths lying on the ground, but did not go in. Simon Peter who was following now came up, went right into the tomb, saw the linen cloths on the ground, and also the cloth that had been over his head; this was not with the linen cloths but rolled up in a place by itself. Then the other disciple who had reached the tomb first also went in; he saw and he believed. Till this moment they had failed to understand the teaching of scripture, that he must rise from the dead.

Volunteers Needed | 2 New Teams **RCIA Support Team and Sacramental Program Support**

Sr Salvacion, as Pastoral Coordinator, heads up both our RCIA (adult initiation) and our Parish Sacramental Program (Confirmation | First Eucharist | Penance) under the direction of Fr Joshy Parappully as Parish Priest.

As Pastoral Coordinator she is developing 2 new parish lay based groups to support her in this role and provide an ongoing program that will provide smooth continuity from one year to the next,.

Parish Sacramental Program

Sr Salvacion and the Missionaries of Charity Sisters together are the main teachers and facilitators of our program that combines the groups from all of our churches and schools within our parish boundaries. They are requiring a volunteer team to support them in the general running of each Sacramental Program-there are 3 sacramental programs each year. The successful applicants will be required to attend all functions including Information Evenings, Retreat days (normally a Saturday) and the celebration itself. They will be required to work as a team to assist in administrations, registrations, catering and any other requirements at the direction of the Pastoral Coordinator.

RCIA

Sr Salavacion and Deacon Adam Walk facilitate the RCIA program and require a parish based team to assist in the administration of the group as well as a desire to undertake training in Pastoral Ministries, part of the training would be attendance at the RCIA Formation Day Sunday 18 April. 1-4pm.

Ideal qualities for these roles would include a desire to be of service, a willingness to work as a team, undertake a full induction and training program, take directions, and have good organisational skills to carry out the program in place. If you are interested in applying to volunteer in either of these teams please contact the Parish Office directly. Note all volunteers are required to be registered within the parish and complete all the safeguarding steps.

The Archdiocese of Brisbane has standards of conduct for workers to maintain a safe and healthy environment for children. Our commitment to these standards requires that we conduct working with children checks and background referencing for all persons who will engage in direct and regular involvement with children and young people (0 - 18 years) and/or vulnerable adults. The organisation is fully committed to child safety and has a 0 tolerance to abuse of children or vulnerable adults.

Anxiety, friendships, body image worries, and a lack of resilience are keeping too many girls awake at night, and they are not always confiding in us. That's my take-out after researching Ten-Ager, what your daughter needs to know about the transition from child to teen. It includes the counsel of 500 10-year-old girls, 2000 parents, 100 middle-school teachers and dozens of school principals, counsellors and parenting experts. 
Praying with MESSIAH
