This weekend we have the parable of the vineyard and the tenants. The image of the vineyard is taken from the Old Testament and the servants mentioned in the parable represent the prophets who spoke on behalf of God and tried to bring them back. Instead of listening to their word they maltreated them and some they even killed. Two leading thoughts come to our mind after listening to the parable of today. First, the infinite goodness, patience, and the mercy of God in his dealing with humankind and secondly, the wickedness and ingratitude to which man can sink.

To his chosen people God had given every good thing indicated in the parable of the vineyard giving them protection, care, and all other facilities. All that God asked in return was their cooperation. But they had other plans and did not listen to His messengers and disobeyed Gods commandments. Yet God was patient with them and again and again pardoned their infidelities and sent His only beloved Son Jesus to them, saying, "They will respect my Son."

The Gospel concludes with the words that the Kingdom of God will be taken away from those who do not care about it and given to a people that produce the fruits of the Kingdom. With St. Francis of Assisi let us pray;

Entrance Antiphon

Cf. Est 4: 17

Within your will, O Lord, all things are established, and there is none that can resist your will. For you have made all things, the heaven and the earth, and all that is held within the circle of heaven; vou are the Lord of all.

First reading

Isaiah 5:1-7

Let me sing to my friend the song of his love for his vineyard. My friend had a vineyard on a fertile hillside. He dug the soil, cleared it of stones and planted choice vines in it. In the Middle he built a tower, he dug a press there too. He expected it to yield grapes, but sour grapes were all that it gave. And now, inhabitants of Jerusalem and men of Judah, I ask you to judge between my vineyard and me. What could I have done for my vineyard that I have not done? I expected it to yield grapes. Why did it yield sour grapes instead?

Very well, I will tell you what I am going to do to my vineyard: I will take away its hedge for it to be grazed on, and knock down its wall for it to be trampled on.

I will lay it waste, unpruned, undug; overgrown by the briar and the thorn. I will command the clouds to rain no rain on it. Yes, the vineyard of the Lord of Hosts is the House of Israel, and the men of Judah that chosen plant. He expected justice, but found bloodshed, integrity, but only a cry of distress.

Jesus said to the chief priests and the elders of the people, 'Listen to another parable. There was a man, a landowner, who planted a vineyard; he fenced it round, dua a winepress in it and built a tower; then he leased it to tenants and went abroad. When vintage time drew near he sent his servants to the tenants to collect his produce. But the tenants seized his servants, thrashed one, killed another and stoned a third. Next he sent some more servants, this time a larger number, and they dealt with them in the same way. Finally he sent his son to them. "They will respect my son" he said. But when the tenants saw the son,

they said to each other, "This is the heir. Come on, let us kill him and take over his inheritance." So they seized him and threw him out of the vineyard and killed him. Now when the owner of the vineyard comes, what will he do to those tenants?' They answered, 'He will bring those wretches to a wretched end and lease the vineyard to other tenants who will deliver the produce to him when the season arrives.' Jesus said to them, 'Have you never read in the scriptures:

It was the stone rejected by the builders that became the keystone. This was the Lord's doing and it is wonderful to see? 'I tell you, then, that the kingdom of God will be taken from you and given to a people who will produce its fruit.'

Meals Delivery Service - Kurilpa Kitchen West End

Kurilpa Kitchen West End is a Community Care Project for Seniors, our mission is to improve the well-being of seniors, elders and their community through affordable nutritious meals and social activities. We have developed out of the Australian Pensioners & Superannuants League, West End and in partnership with Transit Care for Seniors within a 'south of the river' radius.

With the closure of the Centre resulting from health concerns from the pandemic, with regard to Senior Citizens being able to attend activities, meals and social events, we are subsidised to be able to offer a Meals Delivery Service for those aged 65 and over as a way of keeping in touch with our Senior Citizens and providing a respite from cooking for themselves for a few days of the week.

- We offer 'Contact Free' Delivery of meals (safe & secure) on Tuesdays and Thursdays (no charge for delivery).
- The service is subsidised so we are able to offer our meals at a cost of \$5.00 per meal for up to 6 meals per week.
- We issue a fresh Menu every 4 weeks with a choice of meals on offer and only request that orders be placed in advance for sourcing product and preparing.
- The meals are prepared with nutrition in mind, however not at the expense of taste.
- We issue an invoice each fortnight and have a cashless, pay online facility or via EFT through the bank.
