Twenty-Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time 6th October 2024 - Year B

Today's Gospel has somewhat of an odd question, that being, 'is it against the Law for a man to divorce his wife?' Now, why is this odd? Well, when we go to the book of Deuteronomy 24:1-2, it says 'suppose a man has taken a woman and made her his wife, but she has not pleased him and he has found something objectionable of which to accuse her; he has therefore made out a writ of divorce for her and handed it to her and then dismissed her from his house; she leaves his home and goes away to become the wife of another man.' We see immediately from the Law that divorce was permissible. Divorce was so permissible, that historically, divorce for trivial reasons, was a common occurrence.

Perhaps the real question they were asking Jesus was, 'is it **right** for a man to divorce his wife?' Jesus noted that because they were so 'unteachable' Moses allowed them to 'draw up a writ of dismissal.'

Now on one level, perhaps those that were 'testing' Jesus had an intuition that the divorce proceedings among Jewish men were unjust, inconsistent or unlawful. Maybe they wanted to hear from the wisdom teacher Himself, what was the appropriate way forward. Or perhaps they were so caught up in their ways that hearing Jesus say things like 'The man who divorces his wife and marries another is guilty of adultery against her. And if a woman divorces her husband and marries another she is guilty of adultery too," gave them the ammunition they needed to put him to death.

Whatever the case, Jesus reminds them that discipleship, is more than just following the trends of society, pursuing the sordid desires within or accepting shortcuts that make us complacent. Discipleship is about these words we hear in an earlier part of Mark's Gospel where Jesus says, 'Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me (8:34).

To focus more on Marriage, the Church desires that all humans choose Christ and the precepts of the Lord in absolutely every aspect of their lives, including their marriage. Discipleship includes every part of who we are, not just the Sunday version of ourselves or the versions we present to the Office staff, Church community or social club during the week. **Every** part of ourselves and every aspect of our lives.

It's for this reason that the Church is interested in the minutiae of Marriage, especially around things like sexuality, chastity, celibacy, intimacy, relationships and community because we can easily choose to follow our own designs within these spheres that matter most.

We've seen a breakdown in the institution of the family. Pornography has skewed the act of love and life for pleasure and power. People are struggling to have intimate loving moments because use of the phone and our devices has made it difficult for us to encounter the other.

Marriage, love and relationships is under attack. Our invitation is to ground ourselves in what it means to be a disciple of Christ, attentive to all the ways we might follow the Lord. Let us then be vigilant, teachable and obedient to the Lord, and find freedom as disciples of the Lord from the dangers that seek to separate us from each other.

READINGS AT MASS

First reading: Genesis 2:18-24

The Lord God said, 'It is not good that the man should be alone. I will make him a helpmate.' So from the soil the Lord God fashioned all the wild beasts and all the birds of heaven. These he brought to the man to see what he would call them; each one was to bear the name the man would give it. The man gave names to all the cattle, all the birds of heaven and all the wild beasts. But no helpmate suitable for man was found for him. So the Lord God made the man fall into a deep sleep. And while he slept, he took one of his ribs and enclosed it in flesh. The Lord God built the rib he had taken from the man into a woman, and brought her to the man. The man exclaimed:

'This at last is bone from my bones, and flesh from my flesh! This is to be called woman, for this was taken from man.' This is why a man leaves his father and mother and joins himself to his wife, and they become one body.

Responsorial Psalm:

May the Lord bless us all the days of our lives.

O blessed are those who fear the Lord and walk in his ways!
By the labour of your hands you shall eat. You will be happy and prosper. **R/**

Your wife will be like fruitful vine in the heart of your house; your children like shoots of the olive, around your table. **R**/

Indeed thus shall be blessed the man who fears the Lord. May the Lord bless you from Zion in a happy Jerusalem all the days of your life! May you see your children's children. On Israel, peace! **R/**

Second reading: Hebrews 2:9-11

We see in Jesus one who was for a short while made lower than the angels and is now crowned with glory and splendour because he submitted to death; by God's grace he had to experience death for all mankind.

As it was his purpose to bring a great many of his sons into glory, it was appropriate that God, for whom everything exists and through whom everything exists, should make perfect, through suffering, the leader who would take them to their salvation. For the one who sanctifies, and the ones who are sanctified, are of the same stock; that is why he openly calls them brothers.

Gospel Acclamation:

If we love one another, God will live in us in perfect love. Alleluia!

Gospel: Mark 10:2-16

Some Pharisees approached Jesus and asked, 'Is it against the law for a man to divorce his wife?' They were testing him. He answered them, 'What did Moses command you?' 'Moses allowed us' they said 'to draw up a writ of dismissal and so to divorce.'

Then Jesus said to them, 'It was because you were so unteachable that he wrote this commandment for you. But from the beginning of creation God made them male and female. This is why a man must leave father and mother, and the two become one body. They are no longer two, therefore, but one body. So then, what God has united, man must not divide.' Back in the house the disciples questioned him again about this, and he said to them, 'The man who divorces his wife and marries another is guilty of adultery against her. And if a woman divorces her husband and marries another she is guilty of adultery too.'

People were bringing little children to him, for him to touch them. The disciples turned them away, but when Jesus saw this he was indignant and said to them, 'Let the little children come to me; do not stop them; for it is to such as these that the kingdom of God belongs. I tell you solemnly, anyone who does not welcome the kingdom of God like a little child will never enter it.' Then he put his arms round them, laid his hands on them and gave them his blessing.

ARCHDIOCESE OF BRISBANE & FLOCKNOTE



Parishioners regular and attendees are invited to use the link or QR code and signup and register with the parish. If you have any questions, please see a priest, or speak with the Parish office.




