Ask, and it will be given to you

Back in 2023, Archbishop Mark rolled out a document called **With Lamps Ablaze**. The title referred to the parable of the ten bridesmaids. Archbishop Mark noted that lamps must be properly tended if they are to give light that leads to Him who is Light.

Archbishop Mark named seven priorities that we could focus on as a diocese, so that our lamps don't just flicker and waver in the winds and storms of the world, but burn brightly and are set ablaze with light for those who are in darkness.

The first priority is Teaching Prayer. In his wisdom, Archbishop Mark recognised that prayer undergirds all priorities and activities within the diocese. If we are not a people of prayer, then we are not followers of Christ. As the priority suggests, it's not just that we should be urging people to pray—that is a given—but that we need to teach people how to pray. This, too, is the question posed by Jesus' disciples in our Gospel this week: "Lord, teach us to pray, just as John taught his disciples."

One major insight offered by the Archbishop is to begin by listening. Learning to pray is, therefore, learning to listen. God has already spoken, and God's Word continues to animate lives and hearts—especially for those willing to hear.

How good am I at listening? Many people interrupt before we've finished speaking. Others pretend to listen but are distracted. Some listen to respond rather than to understand. Others still dismiss your words with quick judgments, and some people change the subject to talk about themselves. These are all signs of poor listening—and if you're anything like me, these habits often ooze into prayer time as well. Essentially, if I'm not good at listening, then I should certainly examine how I pray.

God is ever patient and knocks on the door of our hearts, waiting to be with us. We have the power to open the door and let the Lord reside within. Prayer is the tool that allows this to happen. By opening our ears and humbly taking the back seat, may we learn to listen to one another—so that, ultimately, we might listen to God in prayer.

Readings at Mass

First Reading

Genesis 18:20-32

The Lord said, 'How great an outcry there is against Sodom and Gomorrah! How grievous is their sin! I propose to go down and see whether or not they have done all that is alleged in the outcry against them that has come up to me. I am determined to know.'

The men left there and went to Sodom while Abraham remained standing before the Lord. Approaching him he said, 'Are you really going to destroy the just man with the sinner? Perhaps there are fifty just men in the town. Will you really overwhelm them, will you not spare the place for the fifty just men in it? Do not think of doing such a thing: to kill the just man with the sinner, treating just and sinner alike! Do not think of it! Will the judge of the whole earth not administer justice?' the Lord replied, 'If at Sodom I find fifty just men in the town, I will spare the whole place because of them.'

Luke 11:1-13

Once Jesus was in a certain place praying, and when he had finished one of his disciples said, 'Lord, teach us to pray, just as John taught his disciples.'

He said to them, 'Say this when you pray:
"Father, may your name be held holy,
your kingdom come;
give us each day our daily bread,
and forgive us our sins,
for we ourselves forgive each one who is in debt to
us. And do not put us to the test."

He also said to them:

'Suppose one of you has a friend and goes to him in the middle of the night to say, "My friend, lend me three loaves, because a friend of mine on his travels has just arrived at my house and I have nothing to offer him"; and the man answers from inside the house, "Do not bother me. The door is bolted now, and my children and I are in bed; I cannot get up to give it to you." I tell you, if the man does not get up and give it him for friendship's sake, persistence will be enough to make him get up and give his friend all he wants.'

'So I say to you: Ask, and it will be given to you;
search, and you will find; knock, and the door will be opened to you. For the one who asks always receives;
the one who searches always finds; the one who knocks will always have the door opened to him.
What father among you would hand his son a stone when he asked for bread? Or hand him a snake instead of a fish? Or hand him a scorpion if he asked for an egg? If you then, who are evil, know how to give your children what is good, how much more will the heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him!'

Amalgamation Update

Thank you for your patience. As many of you know we have a new Archbishop. Until Bishop Shane is installed, we will have to wait for written approval regarding our Amalgamation. I have been informed by leaders in the Archdiocese to continue with the steps of Amalgamation because we have been approved in principle but not by technicality. With that in mind, the name of our new Parish will be **Good Shepherd Parish, South Brisbane West End**. Our first step is appointing a new Parish Pastoral Council. The back of every Church beginning this weekend should have a nomination form. Parishioners will have an opportunity to vote for someone they think would fit as a representative of the community and advance the mission and values of the Gospel in our local area. We are looking for someone that works well within a team and has skills to offer. We want someone that is a regular and active member of our worshipping communities. We want people who are available for this ministry and not weighed down by other obligations.

Nominations for Council members closes on the 10th of August. For those that are nominated, there will be a Discernment Night where we will spend time in prayer around membership. This will be on the 20th of August at 6pm. More information will be sent to nominated Parishioners.

One more thing to note. Around the Churches there will be a simple roadmap of all the important steps we will take within the next year. The date for these events are unclear, but the order will remain the same. After our formation of the Council, we will have our celebration as a new Parish. Following the celebration, we will form a new Parish Finance Council and then we will work towards a Mission Statement/Vision for our Parish.


Again, I implore you intercession for our Parish over these next few months. I thank you for being on the journey. We pray the Holy Spirit is with us every step of the way.
