

32ND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME 8 November 2020 - Year A

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

The Parable of the Ten Bridesmaids in this Sunday's Gospel foreshadows the day of judgment. The bridegroom is Christ, and the wedding feast is eternal life with Christ. The sensible and foolish bridesmaids illustrate the merits of preparation, and the costs of procrastination, respectively.

The sensible bridesmaids were prepared for the bridearoom's arrival, with sufficient oil for their lamps. While they did doze off, once alerted they "woke up and trimmed their lamps" (Mt 25:7) and "went in with [the bridegroom] to the wedding hall and the door was closed" (Mt 25:10). The sensible bridesmaids ended up where they were supposed to be; at the wedding feast with the bridegroom. And yet, while the sensible bridesmaids were with the bridegroom, the foolish ones were trying to make up for their lack of preparation. The foolish bridesmaids are, at best, blasé about the prospect of the bridegroom's arrival. It is if they either don't care, or they decided to defer their preparation to another day. You will, like me, identify this as procrastination; something of which we are all guilty at times. We read what happened; when the foolish bridesmaids asked for the door to the wedding hall to be opened the response was: "I tell you solemnly, I do not know you" (Mt 25:12). When it comes to our faith lives where do we sit on the preparation-procrastination spectrum? For procrastinators, sanctity is something for tomorrow. Procrastinators may ask themselves: Will I have oil for my lamp? Will I miss the

We want you to be quite certain, brothers, about those who have died, to make sure that you do not grieve about them, like the other people who have no hope. We believe that Jesus died and rose again, and that it will be the same for those who have died in Jesus: God will bring them with him. We can tell you this from the Lord's own teaching, that any of us who are left alive until the Lord's coming will not have any advantage over those who have died. At the trumpet of God, the voice of the archangel will call out the command and the Lord himself will come down from heaven; those who have died in Christ will be the first to rise, and then those of us who are still alive will be taken up in the clouds, together with them; to meet the Lord in the air. So we shall stay with the Lord for ever. With such thoughts as these you should comfort one another.

At this, all those bridesmaids woke up and trimmed their lamps, and the foolish ones said to the sensible ones, "Give us some of your oil: our lamps are going out." But they replied, "There may not be enough for us and for you; you had better go to those who sell it and buy some for yourselves." They had gone off to buy it when the bridegroom arrived. Those who were ready went in with him to the wedding hall and the door was closed. The other bridesmaids arrived later. "Lord, Lord," they said "open the door for us." But he replied, "I tell you solemnly, I do not know you." So stay awake, because you do not know either the day or the hour.'

During the week there were ups and downs with our volunteers due to family commitments and other duties. One of the volunteers put the blame on me saying "Sister there are many people jobless in Australia find them a job but please stop finding jobs for your volunteers". replied: "Didn't you know I'm just doing my duty as a job agent? But I always trust God will provide. True enough last week we welcomed Chris Bolaer from St Mary's to our team of dedicated volunteers who had already been and will be helping us do the pick up of some supplies that we need from the Foodbank. Thank you Christ and Bernadette our Secretary for your hard work behind the scene providing all the necessary paperwork in order for us to have access to foodbank. Last Wednesday it was a very uplifting experience to encounter once again the face of Christ in the person that we served. The elderly woman receiving the meals was so grateful, she said, "Anything is good and delicious when we are hungry and a single visit, a little smile and a simple Hello, no matter if it is coming from a stranger or a friend it means a lot to people who suffer from loneliness and isolation like me." With this in mind I told myself: "The simple things in life can mean such a lot and I always thig of this and how fortunate I am and how happy it makes me feel being a part of this community and an army of volunteers making a difference. I guess it is in the satisfied faces of individuals at our weekly visits and meal deliveries that continue to tell the story of hope, life and joy..... This has changed people's lives in ways we never know or understand. One of the residents rushed and eagerly shook my hand and gave me \$9 in gold coins saying: " want you to know how much your support means to people like me, you juys are tremendous. There are no words that can explain how grateful I am for the great support that the community has given to St Francis Table Ministry to the Elderly, families and the homeless. Volunteers are the heartbeat of this ministry who continually dedicate priceless hours and strive to help us spread the message of love, care, hope and compassion every day. We appreciate your support and patience during Covid-19 Pandemic and beyond.
