SIXTH SUNDAY OF EASTER 9 May 2021 - Year B

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

As we approach the end of Eastertide, today's readings continue to unpack the implications of what Jesus did on the Cross.

In the first reading from Acts we hear that "... anybody of any nationality who fears God and does what is right is acceptable to him" (Acts 10:35). And to the Jews' surprise, that includes pagans! Anybody - in fact, everybody - is acceptable to God! He welcomes all and, through the Holy Spirit, he equips us all, in our own way, to proclaim His greatness. It is a good news story. God has a place for us in His Kingdom and He has a plan for us, acting in our lives through the workings of the Holy Spirit.

While God reaches out to us and wants a relationship with us, we must play our part. We have to approach Him, to respond to His call. If we don't respond to Him, we may well become lost in the way Jesus describes in the Gospel: "... not one is lost except the one who chose to be lost" (Jn 17:12). In this sense, we can find God or we can risk becoming lost. The choice is ours.

So, what does responding to His call look like? What does this mean in practice? The readings tell us. Do what is right (Acts 10:35). And, love one another in the way God loves us (1 Jn 4:10).

Acts 10:25-26,34-35,44-48

As Peter reached the house Cornelius went out to meet him, knelt at his feet and prostrated himself. But Peter helped him up. 'Stand up,' he said 'I am only a man after all!'

Then Peter addressed them: 'The truth I have now come to realise' he said 'is that God does not have favourites, but that anybody of any nationality who fears God and does what is right is acceptable to him.'

While Peter was still speaking the Holy Spirit came down on all the listeners. Jewish believers who had accompanied Peter were all astonished that the gift of the Holy Spirit should be poured out on the pagans too, since they could hear them speaking strange languages and proclaiming the greatness of God. Peter himself then said, 'Could anyone refuse the water of baptism to these people, now they have received the Holy Spirit just as much as we have?' He then gave orders for them to be baptised in the name of Jesus Christ. Afterwards they begged him to stay on for some days.
