When Jesus was baptised, the heavens were opened and the Spirit of God came upon him

I looked up Baptism in the Catechism. These two paragraphs stood out to me as I read. **1272** Incorporated into Christ by Baptism, the person baptised is configured to Christ. Baptism seals the Christian with the indelible spiritual mark (character) of his belonging to Christ. No sin can erase this mark, even if sin prevents Baptism from bearing the fruits of salvation. Given once for all, Baptism cannot be repeated.

The catechism mentions an indelible mark that cannot be erased by sin, brokenness or weakness. Many Catholics may not be aware of this, but we do recognise one baptism if the correct formula is used. The formula: (name of person) I baptise you, in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. There was a slight controversy a couple of years ago with people who were baptised with the formula, 'We baptise you...', which is also an incorrect formula because it's not 'we, the Church,' that baptises the individual, but Christ Himself who baptises. The personal pronoun follows after the words that Jesus proclaims over each individual. Of course, the right names must be used as well, e.g. Father, Son and Holy Spirit, not Creator, Redeemer and Sanctifier. For many reasons, we must stick to the books for these Sacraments, but the other thing to keep in mind is; once you've been baptised, there's no need to be rebaptised. There's a trend among young adults who, in an endeavour to claim their faith, request a rebaptism. Such a thing does not exist in our faith; rather, it's an invitation to begin today in the way we live our lives more intentionally for the Gospel. Let us not delay, but we swift in our response to God's grace.

Finally, the second paragraph, **1273** Incorporated into the Church by Baptism, the faithful have received the sacramental character that consecrates them for Christian religious worship. The baptismal seal enables and commits Christians to serve God by a vital participation in the holy liturgy of the Church and to exercise their baptismal priesthood by the witness of holy lives and practical charity.

The indelible mark has a Sacramental character that makes us feel at home in worship. We might not understand entirely what's happening at Mass, but it feels familiar, and it feels like home. This is the grace of the Sacramental gift - that the soul's default position is a position of worship toward our God. All of this has been provided through the gateway of baptism.

As we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord, let us remember its indelible mark upon us, and live out its witness following after the Lord in the way he ministered to the world.






