No-one has come back to praise God, only this foreigner

My brothers and sisters, in this weekend's Gospel, ten men suffering from leprosy met Jesus on the way to Jerusalem. They were suffering and alone, hoping for a miracle. Jesus saw them, heard their cry, and healed them. But only one man returned to say "thank you." He was the only one who truly understood what had happened: he had been healed not only physically, but also heartily.

Illness is something that affects many people in our lives today. Some of us face illness, while others walk alongside loved ones who are suffering. Among the most difficult battles is cancer. It brings pain, fear, and many changes to our lives. Yet, even in the midst of all this, God is with us. His miracles still happen every day.

Sometimes God heals our bodies; other times, He gives us strength, peace, or courage to face each new day. These too are miracles, silent miracles that show that His love is still at work.

Like the man who returned to thank Jesus, we are called to live with grateful hearts. Gratitude helps us see God's blessings, even in times of struggle. It reminds us that we are never alone and that goodness still shines through in the darkest moments.

When we thank God, we also learn to serve others. Gratitude turns into love when we reach out to those who suffer more than we do, with a visit, a kind word, or a helping hand. This is how we demonstrate that we truly understand what God has done for us.

May this week remind us to pause, to notice God's goodness, and to say "thank you" with our words, with our hearts, and with our actions.

First Reading

Naaman the leper went down and immersed himself seven times in the Jordan, as Elisha had told him to do. And his flesh became clean once more like the flesh of a little child.

This made Jesus say, 'Were not all ten made clean? The other nine, where are they? It seems that no one has come back to give praise to God, except this foreigner.' And he said to the man, 'Stand up and go on your way. Your faith has saved you.'


