THE ASCENSION OF THE LORD 12th May 2024 - Year B

Hello Friends,

Thank you to all those who contributed to the Parish survey! It is now closed. In the end we came to a total of 156 responses of which 94 were online, and 62 were written. I'd like to spend a bit of time speaking to the data. Although we had 156 people reply, 324 people participated in the survey. These numbers came from parents who filled in the survey indicating the number of members in the family. According to our 2023 Mass Count data, the average amount of people across the two Parishes was just under 500 in the month of May. We're currently going through another Mass count in the month of May, we'll wait to see what those counts produce.

In terms of what people would like to see happening in the Parish, an overwhelming amount of people wanted to see more socialising, community focused events. There's a strong thread of Youth Group and Young Adult ministries that Parishioners would like to see. Others are interested in formation opportunities like Adult Faith Formation and bible studies. These are all amazing responses, and we don't need much to get these underway. Expect to see these come about within the next few months. My favourite response was Zumba! Count me in!

Regarding the question of Amalgamation, most people are on board, many are concerned about what it might mean for their Mass centre and their Mass time. Others reserve their opinion until further clarity is provided. The Linking of communities is a tough reality because it also includes tough questions around how our resources are being used and the projection of coming years. We are certainly not getting as many priests as we did in the past but we're almost servicing the same number of Masses we had 20 years ago. This is our reality. We wrestle with this question and the many others that will emerge with a Linking of communities at a communal level but please pray for wisdom and guidance.

We had 85 people put their hand up to volunteer. Some of these people are new and others are regular volunteers. Parishes rely heavily on the good will of volunteers so I would like to take the time to acknowledge and thank those who already do so much for our communities. I know the value of volunteers having been out in our remotest of places being sacristan/altar server/reader/musician and priest all in the one Mass. To our volunteers, Thank you! I would also like to take this opportunity to call others forth from the community. We don't need much, even if it's opening the gate on Saturday evening at St Ita's or a reading on Sunday. Your assistance is appreciated.

The last question was about feedback. This question had our most varied responses. That being said, many were thankful for the new priests in the Parish. People would like to see things happening for the homeless of our area and again we had a push for Youth Group/Young Adult activities.

All in all this survey has given our Pastoral Team good things to assess and hopefully implement. It'll be a resource we engage with regularly to try and respond to the desires of our community. Let me reiterate our dedication to hearing and listening to your thoughts and concerns.

READINGS AT MASS

First reading: Acts 1:1-11

In my earlier work, Theophilus, I dealt with everything Jesus had done and taught from the beginning until the day he gave his instructions to the apostles he had chosen through the Holy Spirit, and was taken up to heaven. He had shown himself alive to them after his Passion by many demonstrations: for forty days he had continued to appear to them and tell them about the kingdom of God. When he had been at table with them, he had told them not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait there for what the Father had promised. 'It is' he had said 'what you have heard me speak about: John baptised with water but you, not many days from now, will be baptised with the Holy Spirit.'

Now having met together, they asked him, 'Lord, has the time come? Are you going to restore the kingdom to Israel?' He replied, 'It is not for you to know times or dates that the Father has decided by his own authority, but you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you, and then you will be my witnesses not only in Jerusalem but throughout Judaea and Samaria, and indeed to the ends of the earth.'

As he said this he was lifted up while they looked on, and a cloud took him from their sight. They were still staring into the sky when suddenly two men in white were standing near them and they said, 'Why are you men from Galilee standing here looking into the sky? Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven, this same Jesus will come back in the same way as you have seen him go there.'

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 46(47):2-3,6-9

R: God mounts his throne to shouts of joy: a blare of trumpets for the Lord

All peoples, clap your hands, cry to God with shouts of joy! For the Lord, the Most High, we must fear, great king over all the earth. **R/**

God goes up with shouts of joy; the Lord goes up with trumpet blast. Sing praise for God, sing praise, sing praise to our king, sing praise. **R/**

God is king of all the earth, sing praise with all your skill. God is king over the nations; God reigns on his holy throne. **R/**

Second reading: Ephesians 4:1-7,11-13

I, the prisoner in the Lord, implore you to lead a life worthy of your vocation. Bear with one another charitably, in complete selflessness, gentleness and patience. Do all you can to preserve the unity of the Spirit by the peace that binds you together. There is one Body, one Spirit, just as you were all called into one and the same hope when you were called. There is one Lord, one faith, one baptism, and one God who is Father of all, over all, through all and within all.

Each one of us, however, has been given his own share of grace, given as Christ allotted it. To some, his gift was that they should be apostles; to some, prophets; to some, evangelists; to some, pastors and teachers; so that the saints together make a

unity in the work of service, building up the body of Christ. In this way we are all to come to unity in our faith and in our knowledge of the Son of God, until we become the perfect Man, fully mature with the fullness of Christ himself.

Gospel Acclamation: Matthew 28:19. 20

Alleluia, alleluia! Go and teach all people my gospel. I am with you always, until the end of the world. Alleluia!

Gospel: Mark 16:15-20

Jesus showed himself to the Eleven and said to them:

'Go out to the whole world; proclaim the Good News to all creation. He who believes and is baptised will be saved; he who does not believe will be condemned. These are the signs that will be associated with believers: in my name they will cast out devils; they will have the gift of tongues; they will pick up snakes in their hands, and be unharmed should they drink deadly poison; they will lay their hands on the sick, who will recover.'

And so the Lord Jesus, after he had spoken to them, was taken up into heaven: there at the right hand of God he took his place, while they, going out, preached everywhere, the Lord working with them and confirming the word by the signs that accompanied it.


HAPPY MOTHER'S DAY!


