Who is my neighbour?

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

This Sunday's readings include the parable of the good Samaritan, perhaps one of the best-known stories in all of Sacred Scripture. Because it is so widely known, it makes me wonder whether we have forgotten just how radical this teaching is.

Sometimes it can be seen as nothing more than one person being good to another person. The parable certainly shows that but the meaning is much deeper. Jews and Samaritans, as peoples, were no fans of each other. There was a massive gulf between them much like there are breaches between groups of people today. Just think of the divisions you read about in the paper, such as between Ukrainians and Russians. I am not saying that every Ukrainian is as antipathetic to every Russian (and vice versa) as the Gospel writer intends by casting Jew and Samaritan in this parable, but the point stands: the Samaritan was not expected by his contemporaries to be a "good" Samaritan in his relations with Jews. And, yet, he was.

He did, in his own way, what Jesus did on the Cross. He loved his neighbour, which is the person in his midst made in God's image and likeness (Gen 1:26). He sacrificed for another, even one who might present as his sworn enemy. He acted for the good of another, as Jesus did from the Cross: "Father, forgive them; for they know not what they do" (Lk 23:34).

The Samaritan, by assisting the Jew, fulfilled the Law unlike the priest and the Levite who undoubtedly knew the Law well. Which character are we? Someone who knows the law of love? Or someone who practises it too?

First Reading

Deuteronomy 30:10-14

Moses said to the people: 'Obey the voice of the Lord your God, keeping those commandments and laws of his that are written in the Book of this Law, and you shall return to the Lord your God with all your heart and soul.

'For this Law that I enjoin on you today is not beyond your strength or beyond your reach. It is not in heaven, so that you need to wonder, "Who will go up to heaven for us and bring it down to us, so that we may hear it and keep it?" Nor is it beyond the seas, so that you need to wonder, "Who will cross the seas for us and bring it back to us, so that we may hear it and keep it?" There was a lawyer who, to disconcert Jesus, stood up and said to him, 'Master, what must I do to inherit eternal life?' He said to him, 'What is written in the Law? What do you read there?' He replied, 'You must love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your strength, and with all your mind, and your neighbour as yourself.' 'You have answered right,' said Jesus 'do this and life is yours.'

But the man was anxious to justify himself and said to Jesus, 'And who is my neighbour?' Jesus replied, 'A man was once on his way down from Jerusalem to Jericho and fell into the hands of brigands; they took all he had, beat him and then made off, leaving him half dead. Now a priest happened to be travelling down the same road, but when he saw the man, he passed by on the other side. In the same way a Levite who came to the place saw him, and passed by on the other side. But a Samaritan traveller who came upon him was moved with compassion when he saw him. He went up and bandaged his wounds, pouring oil and wine on them. He then lifted him on to his own mount, carried him to the inn and looked after him. Next day, he took out two denarii and handed them to the innkeeper. "Look after him," he said "and on my way back I will make good any extra expense you have." Which of these three, do you think, proved himself a neighbour to the man who fell into the brigands' hands?' 'The one who took pity on him' he replied. Jesus said to him, 'Go, and do the same yourself.'


