15th Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year B) 15th July 2018

Today, the lists of our daily needs have expanded far beyond just food. We need a gadget or app for our mobile phone just for everything these days. We have to have good credit and we have to have a car. And we have to have a nice home, suitable for entertaining, and nice clothes. This is all expected of our society today.

In the Gospel today, Jesus encourages his disciples to take nothing for the iourney "except a staff – no bread, no haversack, no coppers for their purses." He expects them to travel light: basic requirements are minimised. The very nature of their task doesn't allow for anything that would distract them from proclaiming the Good News.

But can we really live this way? Regardless of our state in life or vocation, we must confront a hard-hitting fact about Christian discipleship. Jesus continually stresses the tension between the call to follow him and an inordinate attachment to the things of this world. What is it that we simply could not do without in order to be happy? This is not a question about material possessions, or how much we are willing to give up. It really concerns what we deem most essential. If we call ourselves followers of Christ, we must place him at the top of our list of priorities. And that demands that we separate ourselves from anything that impedes our relationship with him.

Once we recognise ourselves as the dependent beings we are, we can rely completely upon the providence of God. What is such a reliance but an imitation of Christ's own example, the one willing to empty himself completely for our redemption? This is how we stand in solidarity with the apostles as they went out on mission. And with this comes a freedom from attachment to fleeting things that are not crucial to who and what we are as persons, and most importantly, as Christians. Because the greatest wealth we can ever possess is found deep within, where we encounter the One in whom we live and move and have our very being.

Here are some questions for you to reflect on this week:

First, where is our security? Are we burdened down by the things we own? Are we owned by them? How free are we to live a fully Christian life as envisioned by the Gospel? How free are we to do the things that Jesus says we should be doing: bringing healing and wholeness into people's lives?

2 Minute Catechism Mass Etiquette: Things To Do And Not Do In Mass

Fast before Mass. It is Church law that one fasts for at least 1 hour before receiving Holy Communion. Water and medicine can be consumed, of course. The purpose is to help us prepare to receive Jesus in the Eucharist.

No Food and Drink in Church. The exceptions would be a drink for small children, water for the priest or choir (if discreet) and water for those who are ill. Bringing a snack into church is not appropriate, because we want to set the church apart as a place of prayer and reflection.

Cross yourself with Holy Water on entering and leaving the **church.** This is a reminder of our Baptism, which made us members of Christ's Church. Just try to remain mindful of what is happening when you do so and don't do it without saying a prayer.

Dress modestly and appropriately. Wear your Sunday Best. As Catholics we believe that God comes down to meet us at every Mass. So, why would we not dress up?

Show up at least a few minutes early. If for some reason you can't be on time, then try to sit in the back so you don't disturb others. Getting to Mass early allows you to pray and prepare yourself better for Mass.
