Fourth Sunday of Advent 22nd December 2024 - Year C

We're swaddled in the joy and anticipation of a newborn child as we journey with Mary who 'went as quickly as she could' to meet with her cousin in the Hill country of Judah. You can feel the excitement leaping from the pages as we listen to our Gospel this weekend. These words have such powerful expressions within our own lives as I'm sure many of you have experienced something similar.

I remember crying tears of joy and relief at the successful birth of my niece, who is now eight years old. So many things need to go right at a birth (and even before that) that it is nothing short of a miraculous occasion. Yet, as we know, being part of this broken world, not every birth goes the way it ought. Many families are scarred by an inability to bear children. Miscarriages, unfortunately, are also common events within our families. Some, find different mediums by which they can give birth, and others adopt. Finally, the great tragedy of our generation is the abortion of millions of children a year across the world - certainly not the way a birth ought to happen. This further emphasises the brokenness of this world.

Hyperbole is often employed in the narratives surrounding abortions with the common example being rape. But this narrative tries to undermine the great evil of abortion itself by conflating the situation with the most extreme of cases that barely make up many of the current abortions. Don't hear me saying that these sexual abuse cases don't exist, I know they do, and it's heartbreaking! But often in the face of such hyperbole it distracts us from what truly matters. I don't present this to sour the mood. I don't enjoy talking about abortion or writing about it for that matter, but if not us, then who? Our young brothers and sisters die daily; it's catastrophic!

Pray for our young babies. Pray for our young men and women. Pray for our society. In this season of Christmas as we prepare for the birth of our Lord and hear of the baby in the womb leaping for joy, may we hold onto the beauty, sacredness and dignity of life, in all it's stages, and be defenders of the child in the womb. Holy Innocents, Pray for us!

READINGS AT MASS

First reading: Micah 5:1-4 He will stand and feed his flock with the power of the Lord

The Lord says this: you, Bethlehem Ephrathah, the least of the clans of Judah, out of you will be born for me the one who is to rule over Israel; his origin goes back to the distant past, to the days of old. The Lord is therefore going to abandon them till the time when she who is to give birth gives birth. Then the remnant of his brothers will come back to the sons of Israel. He will stand and feed his flock with the power of the Lord, with the majesty of the name of his God. They will live secure, for from then on he will extend his power to the ends of the land. He himself will be peace.

Responsorial Psalm:

Lord, make us turn to you; Let us see your face and we shall be saved

O Shepherd of Israel, hear us, Shine forth from your cherubin throne. O Lord rouse up your might, O Lord, come to our help. **R**/

God of hosts, turn again, we implore, Look down from heaven and see. Visit this vine and protect it, the vine your right hand has planted. **R/**

May your hand be on the man you have chosen, The man you have given your strength. And we shall never forsake you again: give us life that we may call upon your name. **R/**

Second reading: Hebrews 10:5-10

This is what Christ said, on coming into the world: You who wanted no sacrifice or oblation, prepared a body for me.

You took no pleasure in holocausts or sacrifices for sin; then I said,

just as I was commanded in the scroll of the book, 'God, here I am! I am coming to obey your will.'

Notice that he says first: You did not want what the Law lays down as the things to be offered, that is: the sacrifices, the oblations, the holocausts and the sacrifices for sin, and you took no pleasure in them; and then he says: Here I am! I am coming to obey your will. He is abolishing the first sort to replace it with the second. And this will was for us to be made holy by the offering of his body made once and for all by Jesus Christ.

Gospel Acclamation: Lk1:38

Alleluia, alleluia! I am the handmaid of the Lord: let what you have said be done to me. Alleluia!



Gospel: Luke 1:39-45

Mary set out and went as quickly as she could to a town in the hill country of Judah. She went into Zechariah's house and greeted Elizabeth. Now as soon as Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the child leapt in her womb and Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit. She gave a loud cry and said, 'Of all women you are the most blessed, and blessed is the fruit of your womb. Why should I be honoured with a visit from the mother of my Lord? For the moment your greeting reached my ears, the child in my womb leapt for joy. Yes, blessed is she who believed that the promise made her by the Lord would be fulfilled.'

Communion Antiphon:

The Virgin is with child, and shall bear a son, and she will call him Emmanuel.
