Important

New Archdiocese of Brisbane Volunteer Requirements Please note, the requirements have changed and the degree of working with children and vulnerable adults is not the only criterion. For example, those in a position of trust, such as Readers and Communion Ministers, and other ministries (Altar Server Coordinator, Altar Servers (over 18 years), Children's Liturgy Coordinator & Leader, Choir/Music Coordinator, Council Members, Groundsman/Gardener, Organists/Musicians with keys, RCIA Leader, Sacramental Preparation/Program Coordinators, Sacristan, Piety Store Convenor, and all those doing Pastoral Care Ministry) must now obtain a Blue Card and Police Check. Cleaner with keys and Counters need to have Police Check. For our parish – all 4 churches:

- All Volunteers need to be registered
- Blue Card and Police Check for certain roles
- Induction must be undertaken in ministry role and approval by Parish Priest before commencement on roster (some roles are by appointment by the Parish Priest only)
- Already hold a Blue Card, or Police Check you will need to provide us with copies and have
 Blue Card linked
- Safeguarding Training mandatory for all volunteers

Dear Parishioners.

Small is beautiful – this might be the motto that we can take from this Sunday's Gospel, which tells us the parable of the mustard seed.

The mustard seed, which is very small, but very potent, because something large can grow out of it.

In fact, all great things seem to begin small. The most precious of all things, life, begins small, and not just that of a mustard seed.

Embryos might not look like much to those who deny them their right to life. But God looks deeper. Like the mustard seed, this is something that is only apparently small. It is the small beginning of a life that is called to communion with the infinite and eternal God. It is something small, but sacred.

Jesus likens the kingdom of God to the smallest mustard seed that grows into a large bush teeming with life when properly nurtured.

There is something wonderful, even miraculous, in the way something as small and seemingly lifeless as a seed can grow into a flower or plant or tree. Over and again in the creation and in God's word, we discover God likes to start with very small things in order to do something great and remarkable.

Think of the Eucharist: the host is a small insignificant piece of bread. Yet the King of creation and Creator of the universe is hiding underneath those appearances. His presence here is small, because he is simple.

In the same way, God doesn't need much at all from us to make wonderful, even miraculous, things happen in our lives and in our world. We may imagine that what we have to contribute is so small as to be completely insignificant. With God, though, nothing is casual or small. Just like an embryo or the tiny seed planted in the earth, God acts in surprising, unexpected ways. A seemingly small and insignificant kind word or gesture or sign of Christian witness on our part can take root and become something remarkable and life-giving in the kingdom of God.

Mark 4:26-34

Jesus said to the crowds: 'This is what the kingdom of God is like. A man throws seed on the land. Night and day, while he sleeps, when he is awake, the seed is sprouting and growing; how, he does not know. Of its own accord the land produces first the shoot, then the ear, then the full grain in the ear. And when the crop is ready, he loses no time: he starts to reap because the harvest has come.'

He also said, 'What can we say the kingdom of God is like? What parable can we find for it? It is like a mustard seed which at the time of its sowing in the soil is the smallest of all the seeds on earth; yet once it is sown it grows into the biggest shrub of them all and puts out big branches so that the birds of the air can shelter in its shade.'

Using many parables like these, he spoke the word to them, so far as they were capable of understanding it. He would not speak to them except in parables, but he explained everything to his disciples when they were alone.

Two Minute Catechism

GESTURE AND POSTURE DURING MASS

Sign of the Cross

We begin and end our celebration of the Eucharist with the Sign of the Cross. By it we acknowledge that God is Father, Son and Holy Spirit. At Mass our prayer is addressed to the Father, through the Son, by the power of the Holy Spirit.

Genuflection

By bending our right knee to the floor, we are showing respect and reverence to the Blessed Sacrament. We always genuflect when coming into the church before going into our seat and when we leave the church.

Standing

There are several times during Mass when we stand. The first is during the Introductory Rites to acknowledge the presence of Jesus. For the same reason, we stand when the Gospel is proclaimed.

Kneeling

In most churches we kneel during the Eucharistic Prayer. Kneeling is a sign of great reverence. (Those who are old or infirm are not obligated to kneel.)

Sitting

We sit when we listen to the Readings during the Liturgy of the Word.

Hands

We usually join our hands when praying. The priest at times extend his hands, inviting us to join with him in prayer.

Processions

There are several processions during Mass: the entrance procession, the procession of the gifts of bread and wine to the altar, and the Communion procession. Sometimes the Gospel Book is brought forward in procession.

Striking of the Breast

This is done when the first form of the Penitential Rite is used in the Introductory Rite. It is a sign of sorrow for our sin.


