

We are consoled that God is our support and strength. In the Gospel, Jesus miraculously feeds five thousand people in the desert with five loaves and two fish. He shows his concern towards people who had left everything and staved with him. This miracle is seen as a foreshadowing of the Eucharistic meal which Christ is going to provide for his followers.

When evening came, the disciples went to him and said, 'This is a lonely place, and the time has slipped by; so send the people away, and they can go to the villages to buy themselves some food.' Jesus replied, 'There is no need for them to go: give them something to eat yourselves.' But they answered 'All we have with us is five loaves and two fish.' 'Bring them here to me' he said. He gave orders that the people were to sit down on the grass; then he took the five loaves and the two fish, raised his eyes to heaven and said the blessing. And breaking the loaves handed them to his disciples who gave them to the crowds. They all ate as much as they wanted, and they collected the scraps remaining; twelve baskets full. Those who ate numbered

about five thousand men, to say nothing of women and children.

Dear Parishioners,

"Start by doing what is necessary, then what is possible, and suddenly you are doing the impossible," -St. Francis of Assisi This beautiful thought of St. Francis has continue to inspired me to do this Parish Pastoral Ministry to the Elderly, families and the homeless along with all our dedicated volunteers during this Coronavirus pandemic. We started with a little group providing support to the most vulnerable, by phone call, shopping, collect and drop off medication and hot meals.

During COVID-19 pandemic restriction so many of our parishioners, the elderly, families, homeless and people in the neighbourhood were affected and had a very hard time, experiencing anxiety, fear and isolation. But our Pastoral team continue to spread acts of love, kindness and to keep more than ever socially and spiritually connected with the people in our local community. A simple "Smile and Hello" and a friendly chat could brighten the day of someone going through a dark and lonely time.

Every week we received lots of little surprises and blessings. As I drove around to drop off the hot meals, they always welcome me with a smile as everyone were waiting. Due to the self-distancing restriction I was at the car park giving away the meals but at the same time exchanging a friendly conversation with them from a distance, telling little jokes and let everyone laugh. So many of them said they only go out of their unit when I come and its like a little reunion and a time to exercise their lungs. They were all so happy and grateful for the love and care we showed them. Then one day a gentleman started to give me a dollar coin as an offering for what I do for them. He said it may be small but it's from the heart. I smiled and thanked him while others also have witnessed what he did and so I shared with them about a story of the poor widow's two coins offering in the Gospel to cut the story short .. Calling his disciples Jesus said: "Truly I tell you, this poor widow has put more into the treasury than all the others. They all gave out of their wealth; but she, out of her poverty, put in everything - all she had to live on" (Mark 12:43-44). Likewise this small act of kindness he did had created an enormous ripple effects on those who had seen it. Now each in their on

little ways want to share and give back the joy and blessings they have received as a sign of their appreciation and gratitude. For them Happiness is not measured by the amount of money they have but it is measured by the wonderful people in their life. Then an envelope was handed to me with a "Thank you" note with their offering . God bless those residents who had given their donations but wants to remain anonymous. As I continue my delivery another Elderly said: "I truly appreciate your kindness in checking up on me, I appreciate your guick message asking me if I'm okay. I appreciate every single visit that brighten my days. For me it's the little things that matter the most."

Once again thank you so much to all who have given us generous donations and continue to support this wonderful ministry. With your help we are able to do not only what is necessary and possible but even the impossible as the ministry keep on growing. God bless you, Sr. Salvacion, sfi
