Dear brothers and sisters, since childhood, my life has been marked by faith and the example of my family. I was born in 1982 and grew up in a very religious home, where prayer, participation in Mass and Christian teachings were part of our lives. It was there, in the northeast of Brazil, in an arid and desert region, in the simple and sincere moments of everyday life, that I began to perceive God's calling on my life.

During my adolescence, this calling became clearer after I began serving in the church as an altar boy and catechist. With the support of my parents and the parish community, I entered the seminary in 1999, driven by the desire to serve God and others. During my philosophical and theological formation in São Paulo, Brazil, I had experiences that were fundamental to deepening my faith and preparing me for the challenges of priestly life.

After my ordination in 2006, I had the grace to serve in several parishes, each with its own beauty and challenges. In each community I served, I was able to learn, grow and further strengthen my mission of being the presence of Christ among the people.

In 2019, I received an invitation from the Bishop of the Diocese of Iguatu, to which I belong, to participate in a missionary project of the Conference of Bishops of Brazil. This project sends priests to various countries around the world where there are communities of Brazilian Catholics who need spiritual assistance in the Portuguese language.

That's how I was sent to Brisbane to be the chaplain of the Brazilian community that lives here. I arrived here in the Archdiocese in November 2022 and since then I have been an assistant priest at the parish of Our Lady of Lourdes, Sunnybank.

Now I begin a new stage in my priestly journey with you. I ask God that I may always be available to announce the Kingdom of God with you. I ask for your prayers for me, for Father William and for all the parishioners.

Readings at Mass

First Reading

Genesis 18:1-10

The Lord appeared to Abraham at the Oak of Mamre while he was sitting by the entrance of the tent during the hottest part of the day. He looked up, and there he saw three men standing near him. As soon as he saw them he ran from the entrance of the tent to meet them, and bowed to the ground. 'My lord,' he said, 'I beg you, if I find favour with you, kindly do not pass your servant by. A little water shall be brought; you shall wash your feet and lie down under the tree. Let me fetch a little bread and you shall refresh yourselves before going further. That is why you have come in your servant's direction.' They replied, 'Do as you say.'
