Jesus said to his disciples: 'The kingdom of heaven is like a landowner going out at daybreak to hire workers for his vineyard. He made an agreement with the workers for one denarius a day, and sent them to his vineyard. Going out at about the third hour he saw others standing idle in the market place and said to them, "You go to my vineyard too and I will give you a fair wage." So they went. At about the sixth hour and again at about the ninth hour, he went out and did the same. Then at about the eleventh hour he went out and found more men standing round, and he said to them, "Why have you been standing here idle all day?" "Because no one has hired us" they answered. He said to them, "You go into my vineyard too." In the evening, the owner of the vineyard said to his bailiff, "Call the workers and pay them their wages, starting with the last arrivals and ending with the first." So those who were hired at about the eleventh hour came forward and received one denarius each. When the first came, they expected to get more, but they too received one denarius each. They took it, but grumbled at the landowner. "The men who came last" they said "have done only one hour, and you have treated them the same as us,

though we have done a heavy day's work in all the heat." He answered one of them and said, "My friend, I am not being unjust to you; did we not agree on one denarius? Take your earnings and go. I choose to pay the last comer as much as I pay you. Have I no right to do what I like with my own? Why be envious because I am generous?" Thus the last will be first, and the first, last.'

Pastoral Care Update

Dear Parishioners,

In the midst of uncertainties and challenges of the current Covid -19 pandemic crisis, the Lord continually assures us that all shall be well. The generosity of God towards us does not rest on our own merits but on His eternal love for us. We cannot earn God's love it is freely given to us. Due to the pandemic restriction and the Covid-19 safe plan being put in place, adjustments/ changes to our Sacramental program this year were necessary. Last Saturday at the 8am Mass in St Mary's South Brisbane, we started the celebration of the Children's First Holy Communion and throughout the week almost everyday at the 7am Mass a couple of children are booked and I had to stretched my time to be present to give spiritual support to the children and their families on this very special day in their life . While at the same time anxious to be on time for the next ministry to cook and deliver meals.

Last Monday I was a little worried that the desserts were running low in supplies. I needed 54 servings and I only had 24 available and had no time to do the shopping. But the mind of God works on a greater and more generous scale than we do. God always works in a mysterious way, he inspired people, touched hearts and performed countless little miracles each day. He knows exactly what we need before we even aske him and guess what happened next? One of my volunteers rostered for the day arrived bringing couple of packets of Cadbury Chocolates and when we repacked them it surprised us all because it was the exact number of serves we needed. Then at other times one morning we had a shortage of take away container and I said to the volunteers we need to ask for donations but suddenly we heard the door knocking and a generous parishioner of St. Francis West End was bringing in a big box of take away containers as her share in the ministry. With joyful hearts we all praise and give thanks to God for the many blessings he has given us.

Thanks to all volunteers who tirelessly give, not only their time to help, but also never come each week empty handed that even their Mum at home sends a tray of eggs, some baked yummy cookies dropped them off at the office because they want to share and care for others. Most of us are not asked to do great things but it is in the small ways that we can all make a difference in the lives of so many of our most vulnerable elderly and families experiencing tough times in our community.

This week let us set aside a few minutes to spend tine in prayer to listen to God speaking in our hearts of his great love for us and asking Him for the grace to respond by sharing His love and blessings to our brothers and sisters.
