There's no doubt that we will hear the Christmas narrative in the coming days, so I'd like to shift our focus to the words of our second reading. St Paul is writing to the Church in Rome, many of who were not yet followers of the Way. There were a few men and women who had come to know Christ, but by and large, Rome had not yet accepted Jesus.

Small numbers and the beginnings of persecution was no reason for Christians to be timid in St Paul's eyes. In fact, now was the time, more than ever, to carry the message of Jesus' resurrection. Nothing was more admirable, supreme or imperative to St Paul than this task of proclaiming Jesus Christ as Lord.

St Paul mentions that we've received grace and our apostolic mission to preach obedience to all. I think it begs the question, in what way have we exercised this apostolic mission? Maybe we struggle to live obedience of faith in our own lives – but we're called to preach it to pagan nations? Maybe many of us feel to unworthy or like a hypocrite to do such a thing.

No matter the case, this mission has been handed onto us by virtue of our baptism. So how will we respond to it? With Christmas around the corner, maybe we might take the time to offer a religious book, video or podcast to a family or friend. Maybe we might lead the prayer at our Christmas lunch. Perhaps we might give of our gifts underneath the Christmas tree to a neighbour, friend or family member we know is struggling.

Can we carry the torch of our apostolic mission into these coming days as we prepare for Christmas? Most of all, calling others into obedience begins with personal obedience. As we draw closer to Christ's birth, there will be an opportunity to return to the Lord in the Sacrament of Penance. We invite you to attend our Second Rite on **Monday 22nd at 6pm, St Mary's**. Personal obedience, is still a significant form of witness and proclamation of the Gospel, but let it not be the only thing we do. With our actions, voice and lives, may we truly proclaim Jesus born to us on Christmas day who has come to save us and bring us into new life.

First Reading

Isaiah 7:10-14

The Lord spoke to Ahaz and said, 'Ask the Lord your God for a sign for yourself coming either from the depths of Sheol or from the heights above.' 'No,' Ahaz answered 'I will not put the Lord to the test.'

Second Reading

Romans 1:1-7

From Paul, a servant of Christ Jesus who has been called to be an apostle, and specially chosen to preach the Good News that God promised long ago through his prophets in the scriptures.

This news is about the Son of God who, according to the human nature he took was a descendant of David: it is about Jesus Christ our Lord who, in the order of the spirit, the spirit of holiness that was in him, was proclaimed Son of God in all his power through his resurrection from the dead. Through him we received grace and our apostolic mission to preach the obedience of faith to all pagan nations in honour of his name. You are one of these nations, and by his call belong to Jesus Christ. To you all, then, who are God's beloved in Rome, called to be saints, may God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ send grace and peace.

Gospel

Matthew 1:18-24

This is how Jesus Christ came to be born. His mother Mary was betrothed to Joseph; but before they came to live together she was found to be with child through the Holy Spirit. Her husband Joseph; being a man of honour and wanting to spare her publicity, decided to divorce her informally. He had made up his mind to do this when the angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, 'Joseph son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary home as your wife, because she has conceived what is in her by the Holy Spirit. She will give birth to a son and you must name him Jesus, because he is the one who is to save his people from their sins.' Now all this took place to fulfil the words spoken by the Lord through the prophet:

The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son
and they will call him Emmanuel,

a name which means 'God-is-with-us.' When Joseph woke up he did what the angel of the Lord had told him to do: he took his wife to his home.
