They all ate and were filled.

The feeding of the five thousand prefigures the Eucharistic celebration. There are elements that are reminiscent of what happens at Mass, but I'd like to highlight one specific principle of our reading to assist us as we engage with the Mass, namely, participation.

Jesus said to the disciples, 'give them something to eat yourselves'. This was not a witty response to catch the disciples off-guard, but rather, an invitation. Not only had Jesus been healing and proclaiming to the crowds, but Jesus was also now preparing to feed them. This, he could have easily done by himself, but by calling the disciples into action, Jesus recognised their role, dignity and value in the participation of the mission. The task of renewing the world was always going to include those who were/are in the world and the disciples were no exception. With Apostolic succession, the line of authority and power given to the apostles and bestowed upon the clergy has allowed for participation to occur at an intimate level. The brokenness of the human man who participates with the grace of the Sacrament to provide food for the hungry is nothing short of a blessing, gift and miracle. Humanity has been found worthy to participate in the work of salvation. There is no greater joy than the salvation of a soul.

As you may know, participation extends beyond the clergy to all the faithful who are sent forth to also engage with the mission, heal the world, and proclaim the truth. This call, or vocation was given to us as Baptism, so it's part of our identity as members of the body of Christ. The mission has a Church, and we are the living stones of the Church call forth from the source and summit to the valleys, neighbouring towns and crevasses to reach the destitute and abandoned.

Finally, the participation that is extended to us in the Mass calls for an attentive and active engagement. We're not meant to be passive recipients of what happens on the altar with 'Father' but pilgrims who walk hand in hand with the priest. As I've mentioned before, it's an appropriate response to feel emotionally drained after a Mass.

This weekend we celebrate the Feast of Corpus Christ, which is the Body and Blood of our Lord broken, poured out and offered for us. May we respond to this feast conscious of our role making Christ's body present in our workplaces, schools and social circles. This is how we participate with the work of the Lord.

 It was late afternoon when the Twelve came to him and said, 'Send the people away, and they can go to the villages and farms round about to find lodging and food; for we are in a lonely place here.'

He replied, 'Give them something to eat yourselves.' But they said, 'We have no more than five loaves and two fish, unless we are to go ourselves and buy food for all these people.' For there were about five thousand men. But he said to his disciples, 'Get them to sit down in parties of about fifty.' They did so and made them all sit down. Then he took the five loaves and the two fish, raised his eyes to heaven, and said the blessing over them; then he broke them and handed them to his disciples to distribute among the crowd. They all ate as much as they wanted, and when the scraps remaining were collected they filled twelve baskets.

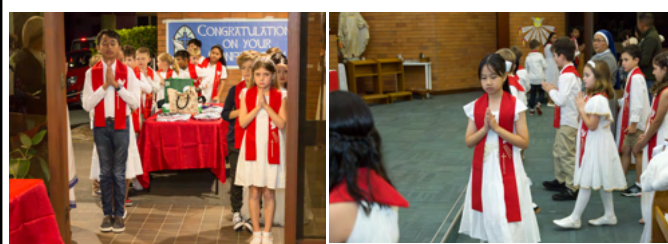
