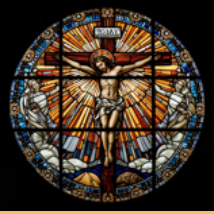

Solemnity of Christ The King
23rd November 2025



'Today you will be with me in paradise'

As we celebrate the Feast of Christ the King today, I'm taken back to the beginning when the people of Israel were demanding a King from God and the prophet Samuel.

If we go back further, before the prophet Samuel, God promises Abraham that kings would emerge from his lineage (Gen 17:6) and that same promise was repeated to Jacob (Gen 35:11).

When we read Samuel 8, both the Lord and Samuel seem displeased that the people asked for a king. So, if God had already declared that kings would emerge, why the displeasure when the people of Israel asked? Well, the displeasure seems to stem from their motivation. The people of Israel wanted a king because they wanted the security of every other nation around them. They had seen what a king meant for the surrounding nations, and rather than relying on God's providence and plan, they were captured by the semblance of security, comfort and power they had seen over the fence.

We see how Saul fared as a King, and even though David was appointed and anointed as God's chosen, we see how small decisions led him away from the Lord until he eventually ended up corrupting his office. Perhaps it's not power that corrupts but our lack of fidelity to the Lord that erodes the character of God's chosen. Maybe if Israel would have waited for God's appointed king to emerge naturally a different story would have been written. Perhaps if David remained true to the Lord all his days we'd see a different leadership within our world.

All of it points to the fact that today is a reminder of the fidelity Jesus had to the Father. We saw his leadership. It was humbly submitting to the will of the Father, doing the Father's work (proclaiming the Kingdom of God) and ultimately, freely giving his life in obedience to the Father.

The kind of King Jesus portrayed was the one humanity needed from the beginning. It's that fidelity, submission and dedication that we honour today. We pray that at least half of what Jesus displayed in his leadership and following of God the Father, would live within all of us. Jesus Christ, King of the universe, have mercy on us.

First Reading

2 Samuel 5:1-3

All the tribes of Israel then came to David at Hebron. 'Look' they said 'we are your own flesh and blood. In days past when Saul was our king, it was you who led Israel in all their exploits; and the Lord said to you, "You are the man who shall be shepherd of my people Israel, you shall be the leader of Israel."' So all the elders of Israel came to the king at Hebron, and King David made a pact with them at Hebron in the presence of the Lord, and they anointed David king of Israel.

Colossians 1:12-20

He is the image of the unseen God
and the first-born of all creation,

Above him there was an inscription: 'This is the King of the Jews.'

One of the criminals hanging there abused him. 'Are you not the Christ?' he said. 'Save yourself and us as well.' But the other spoke up and rebuked him. 'Have you no fear of God at all?' he said. 'You got the same sentence as he did, but in our case we deserved it: we are paying for what we did. But this man has done nothing wrong. Jesus,' he said 'remember me when you come into your kingdom.' 'Indeed, I promise you,' he replied 'today you will be with me in paradise.'
