## Palm Sunday (Year B) 25th March 2018

What an amazing 3 weeks! Words cannot describe my experience of the pilgrimage to the Holy Land, Assisi and Rome. It was a profound and powerful pilgrimage. There were 22 of us, and the pilgrimage was a lifechanging experience for all of us. The 3 weeks went by so quick. As promised, I remembered all of you in prayers during the pilgrimage.

Our pilgrimage began in the Holy Land. We went to Mt Nebo, the Jordan River where Jesus was baptised (although the Israeli think they have the actual site), Bethlehem, Nazareth, Tiberius, Galilee, Capernaum, Mt Tabor, Mt. Carmel, Haifa, and of course Jerusalem! I loved every second of it. I felt I was watching the pages of the Bible unfold before me. To have walked in the footsteps of the Lord, to have breathed the air that He breathed, to have seen the sights that he saw, to be able to visualise the scene of so many of the Lord's miracles - it was just miraculous! The Gospel became real and tangible for us whenever we had mass. We had Mass on one of those 'Jesus boats' on the Sea of Galilee and I would say it was like having Jesus on the boat with us. You could sense Jesus walking on it towards you. It was magical!

Our next stop was Assisi and La Verna. The place where it all started for us Franciscans. We visited the tombs of St Francis and St Clare, and some of the churches that St Francis rebuilt. It was like coming home for me. No matter how many times I have been in Assisi, I always feel a sense of peace and stillness from the place. The spirit of St Francis is alive in this special little town of Umbria.

Our final stop was the Eternal City - Rome. Here we visited the tomb of St Peter and the Necropolis under the Vatican Basilica, the Colosseum, the catacomb, St. Peter's Basilica, the holy steps (which we had to climb up on our knees), the Basilica of St. John Lateran, and St Mary Major. On Wednesday we woke up early for the audience with Pope Francis in front

# Fasting and Abstinence on Good Friday

### 1) Abstinence:

No meat may be eaten on days of abstinence. Catholics 14 years and older are bound to abstain from meat. The sick, pregnant and nursing mothers are exempt.

### 2) Fasting:

- Fasting means having only one full meal to maintain one's strength. Two smaller, meatless and penitential meals are permitted according to one's needs, but they should not together equal the one full meal. Eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.

- Catholics from 18 to 59 years old are bound to fast. Again, the sick, pregnant and nursing mothers are exempt.
