SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT 25 February 2024 - Year B

Friends,

It's been about a month since I arrived in the Parish, and I'm privileged to have met so many of you already.

Thank you for the way you've welcomed Fr Ravi and I over the past couple of weeks.

We're well and truly into our Lenten experience and I pray that this season of Lent is deeply fulfilling for many of you as God continues to work in and through your life.

This weekend we continue the story of salvation in Christ as we encounter Abraham and his son Isaac. Last week we heard of the covenant that the Lord established with Noah, but this week we hear about the sacrifice that was being prepared.

We don't get it in our lectionary readings this week, but Isaac asks his Father Abraham as they journey to the place of the sacrifice "Father...the fire and the wood are here but where is the lamb for the burnt offering" to which Abraham replies, "God will provide a lamb for the burnt offering, my son."

We know later that Isaac is not sacrificed on the mountain but becomes the prefigurement of the sacrifice that will eventually take place on another mountain - the mount of Calvary.

Rightly so, the Gospel this week presents to us Jesus transfigured on another mountain almost picking up from the story of Abraham and Isaac. God says to Jesus' companions, 'this is my Son, the Beloved,' the same son who will become the new sacrificial lamb from of old. This beloved son of God has come to redeem Israel and the whole of humanity.

We know that as followers of Christ, the victory over death has already been won in Christ. We're now in the final phase of this ultimate story of redemption awaiting Christ's return.

We're given the privilege of being part of the Lord's victory by the way we live our lives attuned to the Word of God in how we speak and act which is why Lent is central to our sanctification.

So friends, I pray that our observances this Lenten season do indeed draw us closer to Christ, the sacrifice and the saviour, that what we sacrifice humbly and obediently might bring us to a new life or a more Christ-like way of being in this world.

First reading: Genesis 22:1-2,9-13,15-18

God put Abraham to the test. 'Abraham, Abraham' he called. 'Here I am' he replied. 'Take your son,' God said 'your only child Isaac, whom you love, and go to the land of Moriah. There you shall offer him as a burnt offering, on a mountain I will point out to you.'

When they arrived at the place God had pointed out to him, Abraham built an altar there, and arranged the wood. Then he bound his son Isaac and put him on the altar on top of the wood. Abraham stretched out his hand and seized the knife to kill his son.

But the angel of the Lord called to him from heaven. 'Abraham, Abraham' he said. 'I am here' he replied. 'Do not raise your hand against the boy' the angel said. 'Do not harm him, for now I know you fear God. You have not refused me your son, your only son.' Then looking up, Abraham saw a ram caught by its horns in a bush. Abraham took the ram and offered it as a burnt-offering in place of his son.

The angel of the Lord called Abraham a second time from heaven. 'I swear by my own self – it is the Lord who speaks – because you have done this, because you have not refused me your son, your only son, I will shower blessings on you, I will make your descendants as many as the stars of heaven and the grains of sand on the seashore. Your descendants shall gain possession of the gates of their enemies. All the nations of the earth shall bless themselves by your descendants, as a reward for your obedience.'

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 115(116):10,15-19

R: *I* will walk in the presence of the Lord in the land of the living.

I trusted, even when I said: 'I am sorely afflicted,' O precious in the eyes of the Lord is the death of his faithful. **R**/

Your servant, Lord, your servant am I; you have loosened my bonds. A thanksgiving sacrifice I make; I will call on the Lord's name. **R**/

My vows to the Lord I will fulfil before all his people, in the courts of the house of the Lord, in your midst, O Jerusalem. **R**/

Second reading: Romans 8:31-34

With God on our side who can be against us? Since God did not spare his own Son, but gave him up to benefit us all, we may be certain, after such a gift, that he will not refuse anything he can give. Could anyone accuse those that God has chosen? When God acquits, could anyone condemn? Could Christ Jesus? No! He not only died for us – he rose from the dead, and there at God's right hand he stands and pleads for us.

Gospel Acclamation: Matthew 17:5

Glory and praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ! From the shining cloud the Father's voice is heard: this is my beloved Son, hear him. Glory and praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ!

Gospel: Mark 9:2-10

Jesus took with him Peter and James and John and led them up a high mountain where they could be alone by themselves. There in their presence he was transfigured: his clothes became dazzlingly white, whiter than any earthly bleacher could make them. Elijah appeared to them with Moses; and they were talking with Jesus. Then Peter spoke to Jesus: 'Rabbi,' he said 'it is wonderful for us to be here; so let us make three tents, one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah.' He did not know what to say; they were so frightened. And a cloud came, covering them in shadow; and there came a voice from the cloud, 'This is my Son, the Beloved. Listen to him.' Then suddenly, when they looked round, they saw no one with them any more but only Jesus.

As they came down from the mountain he warned them to tell no one what they had seen, until after the Son of Man had risen from the dead. They observed the warning faithfully, though among themselves they discussed what 'rising from the dead' could mean.

Reconcile:


