The tax collector, not the Pharisee, went home justified.

My brothers and sisters, in this weekend's Gospel, Jesus shows us the prayer that reaches the Heart of God and warns against the temptation to turn prayer into a platform for our pride. He shows that what touches God is not beautiful words or religious appearances, but the honesty of the heart. Prayer is the place where our mask falls, where God sees who we truly are. And that is why some are transformed by the power of prayer, while others remain empty, even after saying many words.

The Pharisee in the Gospel is a symbol of a prayer poisoned by pride. He enters the temple not to find God, but to exalt himself. His prayer is a list of achievements: he talks about his fasting, his tithing, his good works, and even compares himself to others to feel superior. He is not before a Father, but before a mirror. This kind of prayer displeases God because it is self-centred and empty of love. He talks a lot, but doesn't listen; he seeks admiration, not conversion.

The tax collector in the Gospel is the symbol of simple and true prayer. He demonstrates the prayer God loves most: that of the humble. He acknowledges his sin, his smallness, his need for mercy. He doesn't justify himself or offer explanations; he simply says, "Lord, have mercy on me." He doesn't present his accomplishments, but his wounds. He trusts not in what he has done, but in what God can do in him. And Jesus declares: it is he who returns home forgiven. Humility opens the door to mercy; those who empty themselves are filled by God.

Finally, Jesus himself is the perfect model of prayer. He never prayed to exalt himself, but to surrender himself. In every prayer, He speaks to God as a loving Father, listening before speaking, and always ending with, "Thy will be done." His prayer is one of trust, adoration, and obedient love. When He lifts His eyes, it is to give thanks; when He kneels, it is to offer Himself for us. In Him, we learn that prayer is not about proving ourselves good, but about allowing God to make us new.

First Reading

Ecclesiasticus 35: 12-14, 16-19

The Lord is a judge
who is no respecter of personages.
He shows no respect of personages to the
detriment of a poor man,
he listens to the plea of the injured party.
He does not ignore the orphan's supplication,
nor the widow's as she pours out her story.
The man who with his whole heart serves God will
be accepted,
his petitions will carry to the clouds.
The humble man's prayer pierces the clouds,
until it arrives he is inconsolable,
nor will he desist until the Most High takes notice
of him,
acquits the virtuous and delivers judgement.
And the Lord will not be slow,
nor will he be dilatory on their behalf.

Gospel

Luke 18: 9-14

Jesus spoke the following parable to some people
who prided themselves on being virtuous and
despised everyone else: 'Two men went up to the
Temple to pray, one a Pharisee, the other a tax
collector. The Pharisee stood there and said this
prayer to himself, "I thank you, God, that I am not
grasping, unjust, adulterous like the rest of mankind,
and particularly that I am not like this tax collector
here. I fast twice a week; I pay tithes on all I get." The
tax collector stood some distance away, not daring
even to raise his eyes to heaven; but he beat his
breast and said, "God, be merciful to me, a sinner."
This man, I tell you, went home again at rights with
God; the other did not. For everyone who exalts
himself will be humbled, but the man who humbles
himself will be exalted.'

for me, which the Lord, the righteous judge, will
give to me on that Day; and not only to me but to
all those who have longed for his Appearing.
The first time I had to present my defence, there
was not a single witness to support me. Every one
of them deserted me – may they not be held
accountable for it. But the Lord stood by me and
gave me power, so that through me the whole
message might be proclaimed for all the pagans to
hear; and so I was rescued from the lion's mouth.
The Lord will rescue me from all evil attempts on
me, and bring me safely to his heavenly kingdom.
To him be glory for ever and ever. Amen.

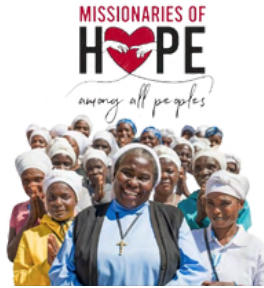

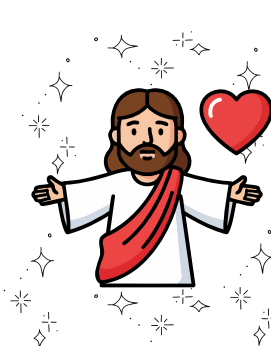
