KEEP PRAYERS IN THE HOUSE
 On further matters political, a petition is being circulated to retain prayers being held at the start of sitting days while state parliament is in session. This counteracts a current move by secularists and certain supportive political parties to scrap it. The petition reads: "Queensland residents draws to the attention of the House that the practice of opening each sitting day of the Legislative Assembly is a right and proper acknowledgement of Australia's legal and cultural heritage which has been decisively shaped by a Christian ethos that continues to foster our free and prosperous democracy. Our constitution opens with the words, "Humbly relying on the blessing of Almighty God". The practice of saying prayers is a longstanding and non-partisan tradition which re-affirms parliamentarians' commitment to the common good of Australia. Our In-digenous heritage is also rightly recognised. Australia was founded with the principle of separation of church and state but it was never intended to keep religious ideas, people or prayers out of public life. It has been proven that there is no constitutional impediment to the existing practice of parliamentary prayers in Australia. In particular, Section 116 of the constitution has been shown not to support any claim of unconstitutionality. Your petitioners, therefore, request the House to continue the tradition of opening parliament with the saying of a Christian prayer, and not order this to cease."

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,
 Today's Gospel tells us about the divine power and infinite mercy of Jesus. The first reading, taken from the Book of Wisdom, tells us that God gave us life and health, and that it was the jealousy of the Satan that produced illness and death. The reading also suggests that the goal of our lives on earth is to know, to love, and to serve God here, with perfect health in body and soul, and to share God's immortal life forever. St Paul in the Second Reading reminds the Corinthians how Jesus, rich though he was becoming poor for our sake, to make them all rich out of his poverty. On the cross he poured out his love on us. He even gave his life that we might have life. And because of that he, too, lives forever. And so, he urges the Corinthian community to share whatever they can spare for their poorer brothers in other churches. He calls it a gracious act because he views the collection and the sharing as a grace from God. The generosity of Jesus is the central theme here also, for Paul describes Jesus' life, death, and Resurrection as "the gracious act of our Lord Jesus Christ." Today's Gospel describes two of our Lord's miracles, the healing of a woman who suffered from a chronic bleeding disease and the returning of the dead daughter of Jairus to life. These healings teach us that Jesus wills life and wills full life for all God's children. They also reveal Jesus as a generous, kind, compassionate God Who wills those men should live their wholesome lives fully, giving us further proof of the Divine power and the Infinite Mercy

of our Saviour. These miracles were worked by Jesus as reward for the trusting Faith of a synagogue ruler and of a woman with a haemorrhage. Although the Faith of the ruler may have been defective, and the woman's Faith may have been a bit superstitious, Jesus amply rewarded the Faith they had by granting them health and life. Lord Jesus, you love each of us individually with a unique and personal love. Touch my life with your saving power, heal and restore me to fullness of life. Help me to give wholly of myself in loving service to others.

Second reading 2 Corinthians 8:7,9,13-15
You always have the most of everything – of faith, of eloquence, of understanding, of keenness for any cause, and the biggest share of our affection – so we expect you to put the most into this work of mercy too. Remember how generous the Lord Jesus was: he was rich, but he became poor for your sake, to make you rich out of his poverty. This does not mean that to give relief to others you ought to make things difficult for yourselves: it is a question of balancing what happens to be your surplus now against their present need, and one day they may have something to spare that will supply your own need. That is how we strike a balance: as scripture says: *The man who gathered much had none too much, the man who gathered little did not go short.*

Gospel Mark 5:21-43
Young girl, I say to you, arise.
When Jesus had crossed in the boat to the other side, a large crowd gathered round him and he stayed by the lakeside. Then one of the synagogue officials came up, Jairus by name, and seeing him, fell at his feet and pleaded with him earnestly, saying, 'My little daughter is desperately sick. Do come and lay your hands on her to make her better and save her life.' Jesus went with him and a large crowd followed him; they were pressing all round him.

Now there was a woman who had suffered from a haemorrhage for twelve years; after long and painful treatment under various doctors, she spent all she had without being any the better for it, in fact, she was getting worse. She had heard about Jesus, and she came up behind him through the crowd and touched his cloak. 'If I can touch even his clothes,' she had told herself 'I shall be well again.' And the source of the bleeding dried up instantly, and she felt in her-

self that she was cured of her complaint. Immediately aware that power had gone out from him, Jesus turned round in the crowd and said, 'Who touched my clothes?' His disciples said to him, 'You see how the crowd is pressing round you and yet you say, "Who touched me?"' But he continued to look all round to see who had done it. Then the woman came forward, frightened and trembling because she knew what had happened to her, and she fell at his feet and told him the whole truth. 'My daughter,' he said 'your faith has restored you to health; go in peace and be free from your complaint.'

While he was still speaking some people arrived from the house of the synagogue official to say, 'Your daughter is dead: why put the Master to any further trouble?' But Jesus had overheard this remark of theirs and he said to the official, 'Do not be afraid; only have faith.' And he allowed no one to go with him except Peter and James and John the brother of James. So they came to the official's house and Jesus noticed all the commotion, with people weeping and wailing unrestrainedly. He went in and said to them, 'Why all this commotion and crying? The child is not dead, but asleep.' But they laughed at him. So he turned them all out and, taking with him the child's father and mother and his own companions, he went into the place where the child lay. And taking the child by the hand he said to her, 'Talitha, kum!' which means, 'Little girl, I tell you to get up.' The little girl got up at once and began to walk about, for she was twelve years old. At this they were overcome with astonishment, and he ordered them strictly not to let anyone know about it, and told them to give her something to eat.

BATTLING VAD LEGISLATION WITH PALLIATIVE CARE PUSH

Queensland State MPs have the interval between now and late August to weigh up how they will use their conscience vote on the assisted suicide and euthanasia legislation (aka VAD legislation). The church is not the only voice in this debate but it doesn't deserve to be marginalised or openly ignored, especially when its position supporting 'palliative care first' is echoed by major medical providers (the Mater, St Vincent's Healthcare, Southern Cross Aged Care), as well as key peak bodies (Australian Medical Association, Palliative Care Queensland, Catholic Health Australia). Each Parish has been sent an advocacy pack for a 'palliative care first' position and not VAD is available in electronic form which will be shared between now and the time of the vote (early September). If a significant number of parishioners heed its call to contact their local MP's in person both via phone and email and express their views, it may give the member pause to reflect on how they will vote. The pack consists of: * a one page 'call to action' * Fact sheets on Palliative care and Euthanasia * a flyer /ad for Catholic Health Australia's 'There is another option' website * some key points of debate to discuss with MPs * a curated selection of cut-through articles by secular figures and medical experts.
