Palm Sunday 28 March 2021 - Year B

Dear Parishioners

With the celebration of the Palm Sunday or the Passion Sunday we enter into the Holy Week. Passion Sunday is a day to reflect on the pain, suffering and death of our Lord Jesus. The day begins with the triumphant entry of Jesus into Jerusalem as King. He is entering with majesty into the Temple city to celebrate the Passover. The gospels record his arrival riding on a donkey, while the crowds spread their cloaks and palm branches on the street and shout "Hosanna to the Son of David" and "Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord." There is the manifestation of joy and enthusiastic welcome from the crowds as Jesus enters Jerusalem. They honour him as their long-awaited Messiah and King who has come victorious. The significance of Jesus riding a donkey and having his way paved with palm branches is a fulfilment of a prophecy spoken by the prophet Zechariah and in so doing emphasized the humility that was to characterize the Kingdom he proclaimed. In those days the regional custom called for kings and nobles to arrive in procession riding on the back of a donkey. The donkey was a symbol of peace and those who rode upon them proclaimed peaceful intentions. The laying of palm branches indicated that the king or dignitary arriving in victory or triumph.

Just as the people gathered on the road and spread their clothes and went in procession so also the church today

Readings at Mass

This gospel is read at the procession with palms before Mass: Gospel Mark 11:1-10

When they drew near to Jerusalem, to Bethphage and Bet any, at the Mount of Olives, Jesus sent two of his disciples, and said to them, 'Go into the village opposite you, and immediately as you enter it you will find a colt tied, on which no one has ever sat; untie it and bring it. If any one says to vou, "Why are you doing this?" say, "The Lord has need of it and will send it back here immediately." And they went away, and found a colt tied at the door out in the open street; and they untied it. And those who stood there said to them, 'What are you doing, untying the colt?' And they told them what Jesus had said; and they let them go. And they brought the colt to Jesus, and threw their gar ments on it; and he sat upon it. And many spread their gar ments on the road, and others spread leafy branches which they had cut from the fields. And those who went before and those who followed cried out, 'Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord! Blessed is the kingdom of our father David that is coming! Hosanna in the highest!'

Six days before the Passover, when the Lord came into the city of Jerusalem, the children ran to meet him; in their hands they carried palm branches and with a loud voice cried out:

O gates, lift high your heads; grow higher, ancient doors. Let him enter, the king of glory! Who is this king of glory? He, the Lord of hosts, he is the king of glory.

Good Friday's Collection

This collection will be given to support the missionary work of the church in the Holy Land. The annual Good Friday collection unites all Christians in supporting our brothers and sisters in the Holy Land. It allows our parishioners to help maintain a presence of Christians in the Middle East.

Volunteers Needed | New Sacramental Team Assistants

Sr Salvacion, as Pastoral Coordinator, heads up our **Parish** Sacramental Program under the direction of Fr Joshy. Sr Salvacion and the Missionaries of Charity Sisters together are the main teachers and facilitators of our program that combines the groups from all of our churches and schools within our parish boundaries.

They are requiring a volunteer team to support them in the general running of each Sacramental Program—there are 3 sacramental programs each year.

The successful applicants will be required to attend all functions including Information Evenings, Retreat days (normally a Saturday) and the celebration itself. They will be required to work as a team to assist in administrations, registrations, catering and any other requirements at the direction of the Pastoral Coordinator.

Ideal qualities for this role would include a willingness to take directions, undertake a full induction and training program, work as a team and have good organisational skills to carry out the program in place.

If you are interested in applying to volunteer in this team please contact the Parish Office directly. Note all volunteers are required to be registered within the parish and complete all the safeguarding steps.

The Archdiocese of Brisbane has standards of conduct for workers to maintain a safe and healthy environment for children. Our commitment to these standards requires that we conduct working with children checks and background referencing for all persons who will engage in direct and regular involvement with children and young people (0 - 18 years) and/or vulnerable adults. The organisation is fully committed to child safety and has a 0 tolerance to abuse of children or vulnerable adults.

Volunteers | Safeguarding Update

All Volunteers who are involved in the following areas will need to complete the Level 2 Online Training now referred to as: Applied Safeguarding Training.

All registered Archdiocesan volunteers who work with children or adults-at-risk must complete the Applied Safeguardina trainina—in addition to the Safeauardina Induction which is the first level training you did when you registered. Follow these instructions to complete and register confirma-

tion. Step 1: Visit the Safeguarding site

Step 2: Scroll down to the Red links and click on Applied Safeguarding Training Video

Step 3: After the training is finished download, complete and sign the Confirmation of Safeguarding Training Completion form and submit to the PARISH OFFICE for verification. After verifying it will be processed through the Archdiocese People & Culture Team.

St Francis Table (this only applies to those who do delivery to the Elderly in their homes and all leaders/supervisors) Sacramental Preparation or Program Coordinators Leaders Outreach—homeless support

ALL new volunteers to these areas need to complete. ALL volunteers who completed the parish level 2 course in 2017—need to complete, as a refresher is required every 2 years.

Safeguarding Children and Vulnerable Adults Prevention and Protection Policy.
