During your life good things came your way just as bad things came the way of Lazarus. Now he is being comforted while you are in agony.

Dear brothers and sisters, this weekend's Gospel presents us with the story of the rich man and Lazarus. It invites us to reflect on how we live our faith, especially in a large city like Brisbane, where so many people go unnoticed amid the routine and hurried lives of the people.

Being sensitive to others: The rich man closed his eyes to the needs of Lazarus at his door. We, as a parish, are called to open our hearts and reach out to those who suffer, through acts of welcome, visits to the lonely, support to those in difficulty, or simply offering a listening ear. Sensitivity transforms the lives of those who suffer and strengthens our community.

Being attentive to God's signs: God speaks to us through His Word and through signs around us. In the Gospel, we see that even the small realities of everyday life are opportunities to perceive His guidance. Being attentive to the Word means reflecting on the Gospel, discerning how God calls us, and allowing our daily choices to reflect His love and justice.

Preparing ourselves for the encounter with God: The Gospel also reminds us of the urgency of our actions. The rich man realized too late that his life needed compassion and solidarity. Every act of love, every service, every commitment to justice and mercy prepares us for the day we will encounter God. Our actions today shape our eternal encounter with Him tomorrow.

My brothers and sisters, may our parish here in Brisbane be a community that looks with love, listens attentively, and acts with courage. May we live the Gospel on every street, in every home, and in every heart, reflecting the light of Christ to all.


Gospel

Luke 16:19-31

Jesus said to the Pharisees: 'There was a rich man
who used to dress in purple and fine linen and feast
magnificently every day. And at his gate there lay a
poor man called Lazarus, covered with sores, who
longed to fill himself with the scraps that fell from the
rich man's table. Dogs even came and licked his
sores. Now the poor man died and was carried away
by the angels to the bosom of Abraham. The rich
man also died and was buried.

'In his torment in Hades he looked up and saw
Abraham a long way off with Lazarus in his bosom. So
he cried out, "Father Abraham, pity me and send
Lazarus to dip the tip of his finger in water and cool
my tongue, for I am in agony in these flames." "My
son," Abraham replied "remember that during your
life good things came your way, just as bad things
came the way of Lazarus. Now he is being comforted
here while you are in agony. But that is not all:
between us and you a great gulf has been fixed, to
stop anyone, if he wanted to, crossing from our side
to yours, and to stop any crossing from your side to
ours."

'The rich man replied, "Father, I beg you then to
send Lazarus to my father's house, since I have five
brothers, to give them warning so that they do not
come to this place of torment too." "They have Moses
and the prophets," said Abraham "let them listen to
them." "Ah no, father Abraham," said the rich man
"but if someone comes to them from the dead, they
will repent." Then Abraham said to him, "If they will
not listen either to Moses or to the prophets, they will
not be convinced even if someone should rise from
the dead."


