You are Peter and on this rock I will build my Church

There's a strong tradition in the Brisbane Archdiocese to ordain men to the priesthood on the Feast of Sts Peter and Paul. In 2021, on this day, I too was ordained to the priesthood alongside three of my other brothers. This day reiterates the authority given to Peter and the missionary activity expressed in Paul for all priests. The hope, of course, is that priests in their ministry and life remain consistent with the apostolic faith and outwardly focused with a desire for all people to come to know Jesus.

Yet, if this hope remains exclusively among priests, then the Kingdom of God would not advance. This message of authority and evangelisation must be alive within all of the faithful; indeed, all of the baptised.

With the emergence of the Synodal way, many theologians have urged us back into a renewal of understanding around our theology of Baptism. In the past, many decisions and decrees were made by Cardinals and Bishops, but a theology of Baptism that recognises the inherent authority of all the baptised in the governance, proclamation and sacrifice of our faith also respects the value that laity have at a table of authority in the Vatican, in the Diocese or in Parish at a local level.

Why does this matter? Well, as I mentioned earlier, the Kingdom of God would not advance. It is true that the decision falls to the Parish Priest or the Bishop at the end of the day but as a collaborative team or members of the Body of Christ, this work has been entrusted to all of the baptised. We need the wisdom, discernment and skills of all of God's children to meet the ever changing landscape of our world.

Today might be a reminder for me in my priesthood of what matters, but I hope it might spark a light of hope in all of us about what it means to be Church. I'm not blind to the many skills and talents that fill our pews. I'm often embarrassed speaking to lecturers and professionals knowing that the Lord has a deep work to do within me.

Nonetheless, the dream, the vision, the hope (call it what you will) is that we all realise our collective place in the life of our local community. There are many people who walk the streets of West End, Dutton Park, Fairfield and South Brisbane who are yet to know Christ. To them we are responsible. I pray that this feast might help us to remember that to them, we bring this light, not in an judgemental and overbearing way, but invitationally, and always in charity. May we truly be a light on the hilltop that all people come to experience.

Readings at Mass

Sts Peter & Paul Apostles
29 June 2025

First Reading

Acts 12:1-11

King Herod started persecuting certain members of the Church. He beheaded James the brother of John, and when he saw that this pleased the Jews he decided to arrest Peter as well. This was during the days of Unleavened Bread, and he put Peter in prison, assigning four squads of four soldiers each to guard him in turns. Herod meant to try Peter in public after the end of Passover week. All the time Peter was under guard the Church prayed to God for him unremittingly.

On the night before Herod was to try him, Peter was sleeping between two soldiers, fastened with double chains, while guards kept watch at the main entrance to the prison. Then suddenly the angel of the Lord stood there, and the cell was filled with light. He tapped Peter on the side and woke him. 'Get up!' he said 'Hurry!' – and the chains fell from his hands. The angel then said, 'Put on your belt and sandals.' After he had done this, the angel next said, 'Wrap your cloak round you and follow me.' Peter followed him, but had no idea that what the angel did was all happening in reality; he thought he was seeing a vision. They passed through two guard posts one after the other, and reached the iron gate leading to the city. This opened of its own accord; they went through it and had walked the whole length of one street when suddenly the angel left him. It was only then that Peter came to himself. 'Now I know it is all true' he said. 'The Lord really did send his angel and has saved me from Herod and from all that the Jewish people were so certain would happen to me.'

rescued from the lion's mouth. The Lord will rescue
me from all evil attempts on me, and bring me
safely to his heavenly kingdom. To him be glory for


