EMBRACING THE COMMUNITIES OF:

1st Sundya of Advent 29 November 2020 - Year B



This week we celebrate the beginning of Advent. This is a liturgical season of four Sundays that begin the Church's year of worship and prepares for Christmas. In a spirit of hope and expectation it first focuses on the second coming of Christ at the end of time, then concentrates on preparation for Christmas. The liturgical colour for the season is violet.

Below is the story of the Advent Wreath.

ADVENT- comes from the Latin word ADVENTUS - meaning **ARRIVAL/COMING** refers to the coming of Christ. Greek word PAROUSIA. The Advent season begins the Church's lituraical year. (Church's calendar) and is a season of preparation for our hearts and minds in commemorating the Lord's birth on Christmas.

The use of the Advent Wreath and candles are full of symbolism tied to the Christmas season.

Before Christ came wreaths had long been in use as symbols of fertility, victory and the like. The first Christians kept the habit of adornment with the wreath but with more significance than ever.

The Advent wreath itself is made of various symbols rich in meanina:

EVERGREEN - signifies continuous life, immortality, fidelity, God is unchanging

CIRCLE - Symbolizes the eternity of God (has no beginning and has no end) God's unending love the immortality of

BAY/LAUREL- Signifies the passion of Christ, not just mourning as before but victory over persecution and suffering.

POMEGRANATE - symbol of the church because of the fruits almost countless seeds and for the hope we place in the resurrection

CEDAR- signifies strength and healing. It is usually associated with prayer, healing and protection against decease. The cedar tree is a symbol of generosity and providence (smell of incense)

PINE CONES - symbolize the new life that Jesus brings through his resurrection

CANDLES - Jesus is the light of the world.

4 CANDLES - four weeks of Advent

3 PURPLE-prayer, penance and sacrifice

1 ROSE/PINK- rejoicing

RED BERRIES- POINSETTIA- colour red points ahead to Jesus' sacrifice and death on the cross, shedding his blood for our sins

HOLLY & YEW or berry like fruits - signifies passion

The wreath as a whole is meant to remind us of both the immortality of our souls and God's promise of everlasting life to us through Christ.

FIRST CANDLE- symbolize HOPE. It is sometimes called the "PROPHECY CANDLE" in remembrance of the prophets, especially Isaiah, who foretold the birth of Christ. It represent the expectation felt in anticipation of the coming of the Messiah.

During this week there were ups and downs with our volunteers due to family commitments and other duties. One of the volunteers put the blame on me saying "Sister there are many people jobless in Australia find them jobs but please stop finding jobs for your volunteers!" I replied "Didn't you know I'm just doing my duty as a job agent" But I always trust God will provide. True enough last week we welcomed Chris Bolger from St Mary's to our team of dedicated volunteers who had already been and will continue to help us to do the pick up of supplies from Foodbank. Thank you to Chris and Bernadette our Secretary for your hard work behind the scene providing all the necessary paperwork in order for us to have access to Foodbank. Last Wednesday it was a very uplifting experience to encounter once again the face of Christ in the person that we served. The elderly woman receiving the meals was so grateful, she said "Anything is good and delicious when we are hungry and a single visit, a little smile and a simple hello, no matter if it is coming from a stranger or a friend it means a lot to people who suffer from loneliness and isolation like me." With this in mind I told myself: The simple things in life can mean such a lot and I always think of this and how fortunate I am and how happy it makes me feel being a part of this community and an army of volunteers making a difference. I guess it is in the satisfied faces of individuals at our weekly visits and meal deliveries that continue to tell the story of hope, life and joy. This has changed people's lives in ways we never know or understand. One of the residents rushed forward and eagerly shook my hand and gave me \$9 in gold coins saying "I want you to know how much your support means to people like me, you guys are tremendous. There are no words that can explain how grateful I am for the great support that the community has given to St Francis Table Ministry to the Elderly, families and the homeless. Volunteers are the heartbeat of this ministry who continually dedicate priceless hours and strive to help us spread the message of love, care hope and compassion every day.
