# THE MOST HOLY TRINITY 30 May 2021 - Year B

Dear Brothers and Sisters

This weekend church celebrates the feast of the Most Holy Trinity and invites us to reflect on the central and most unfathomable mystery of that faith. In our practice of Christian Life, the Trinity is remembered often in prayer and during the daily routine by every Christian. Each time we make the sign of the cross, as we did at the beginning of this celebration, we say: "In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit." The Holy Trinity is the mystery of God in himself - a God who is "one but not solitary". In the Gospel of today, Jesus commissions his disciples to carry on his mission to all nations baptizing them in the name of the Father, Son and the Holy Spirit and promises to be with them till the end times. In the first reading, Moses urges the people to be attentive to God. In doing so, they will enjoy his countless Blessings. In the second reading, Paul refers to the Father, the Son, and the Spirit. By our union with Christ, we are taken up into the family of the Holy Trinity.

In our understanding of the Trinity specific roles however are attributed to them, namely, Father as the Creator, Son as the Redeemer, and the Holy Spirit as the Sanctifier. We see the Trinity at work at the incarnation when Gabriel announces that Mary is having favour with God and the Spirit will come and Jesus will dwell in her womb. At the Holy Mass, the priest begins the celebration of the sacrifice in the name of the Trinity concludes the Holy Mass with a

solemn blessing, again in the name of the Holy Trinity. In all the Catholic liturgy, we find references to the presence of the Blessed Trinity, at Confirmations, during the administration of the Sacrament of Penance, the Anointing of the Sick, the Holy Orders and Matrimony, at funerals, at vigils, at the hours of adoration, and at every liturgical celebration. The Holy Trinity is mentioned in both, the blessing of persons and of objects. In fact, the Holy Trinity which is a mystery is part of our Christian life.

# **Parish Giving**

# Our Parishes need your help. Please consider giving to our Planned Giving Program

I want to take this opportunity to thank the committed parishioners who financially support our parish every week. As you can imagine the cost of running and the upkeep of a parish this size takes a considerable amount and we ask that you prayerfully consider committing to assist our planned giving program. Our Finances, although recovered marginally, after the Covid-19 restrictions, still have not regained to our pre-covid giving and the parish is falling short substantially each month, while the general expenses of insurance, repairs, electricity have increased. In 2020 property & occupancy (ie insurance, repairs & maintenance, utilities was approximate \$188,000 for the 2 parishes.

#### Financial side of our Parish

To help you understand how this works, set out below is a summary of where the finances are distributed.

#### At weekend mass there are 2 collections (resuming in June)

- All parishes pay 18% of total collections to the Archdiocese this covers the Parish Assessment, Priests Foundation and Clergy Sustentation.
- Balance of the 1st Collection goes to the Order caring for our parish to assist with the living costs of the Capuchin Friars ministering in our parish.
- Balance of the 2<sup>nd</sup> Collection goes toward covering the running costs of the parish (e.g. electricity, insurance, wages of staff and maintenance of all buildings.

# Fundraising

 This is separate from the collections as it is for a specific purpose (e.g. renovations of the halls).
