Your peace will rest upon him

As we leave the mountain-top experiences of our Sundays and move into Ordinary Time, our lives begin to settle into their natural rhythms—whatever that may look like for each of us. Like a river flowing steadily onward, we are invited to enter this gentle, ongoing movement.

One key rhythm highlighted in today's Gospel is the Proclamation of the Kingdom of God. Jesus sends out seventy-two disciples ahead of him, to places he himself intends to visit. This detail is important: it reminds us that our mission is to prepare others to encounter Jesus himself. People may sometimes question your integrity, joy, or perseverance. They might ask, "Why are you so happy all the time?" or "Why are you always kind to others?" When the Holy Spirit is stirring in someone's heart, they start to notice these things and wonder what inspires them.

Our role, like that of the seventy-two, is to open minds, prepare hearts, and help people start asking the right questions.

St Paul in our second reading talks about becoming a new creature (new creation). The way of life that Jesus offers us changes us from the inside. We may not look different on the outside, but we've become a new person, a new creature.

I think this is the adventure of a lifetime, that change leads from one thing to the next.

As we continue Ordinary Time, I pray that preparing others to encounter Jesus becomes a natural rhythm of our lives and that we ourselves are open to this encounter daily, that we might become more like Christ.

Gospel

Luke 10:1-12, 17-20

The Lord appointed seventy-two others and sent them out ahead of him, in pairs, to all the towns and places he himself was to visit. He said to them, 'The harvest is rich but the labourers are few, so ask the Lord of the harvest to send labourers to his harvest. Start off now, but remember, I am sending you out like lambs among wolves. Carry no purse, no haversack, no sandals. Salute no one on the road.

'Whatever house you go into, let your first words be, "Peace to this house!" And if a man of peace lives there, your peace will go and rest on him; if not, it will come back to you. Stay in the same house, taking what food and drink they have to offer, for the labourer deserves his wages; do not move from house to house.

'Whenever you go into a town where they make you welcome, eat what is set before you. Cure those in it who are sick, and say, "The kingdom of God is very near to you." But whenever you enter a town and they do not make you welcome, go out into its streets and say, "We wipe off the very dust of your town that clings to our feet, and leave it with you. Yet be sure of this: the kingdom of God is very near." I tell you, on that day it will not go as hard with Sodom as with that town.'

The seventy-two came back rejoicing. 'Lord,' they said 'even the devils submit to us when we use your name.' He said to them, 'I watched Satan fall like lightning from heaven. Yes, I have given you power to tread underfoot serpents and scorpions and the whole strength of the enemy; nothing shall ever hurt you. Yet do not rejoice that the spirits submit to you; rejoice rather that your names are written in heaven.'


