How I wish it were blazing already!

Dear brothers and sisters.

This past Friday, August 15th, we celebrated the Solemnity of the Assumption of Our Lady. With this solemnity, we contemplate Mary's glory in Heaven, but we also recognize that her life on Earth is a model for our own journey as a community of faith. Let's look at some attitudes that help our parish, and us, live with the same hope and mission as Mary.

When Mary learned that her cousin Elizabeth needed help, she "went in haste" to visit her. This simple yet powerful gesture shows us that love doesn't wait. As a parish, we can put this into practice by creating a culture of service, visiting the sick, organizing support for families in crisis, welcoming newcomers to our community, and responding promptly to needs that arise. Every small act of immediate generosity is a way to emulate Mary's loving haste.

When Mary arrived at Elizabeth's home, she was carrying Jesus both in her womb and in her heart. The joy of Elizabeth and the leaping of John in her womb show that the presence of Christ transforms lives. In our parish, we too can "carry" Christ by the way we speak, the kindness in our actions, and the care we show for one another. This can mean sharing our faith in simple conversations, inviting someone to Mass, participating in parish ministries, or even offering to pray with someone who is going through a difficult time. Bringing Christ is not only a priest's mission, it belongs to all of us.

When Mary sang the Magnificat, a song of gratitude and trust, she recognized God's work in her life and in the history of His people. As a parish, we can live it with a spirit of gratitude: offering prayers of thanksgiving at the end of our services, encouraging testimonies of how God has worked in people's lives, and remembering to celebrate the graces and blessings in our community. Gratitude not only strengthens our faith but also inspires others to see God's hand at work in their own lives.

May the Assumption of Our Lady inspire our parish and us to walk together, ready to serve, eager to share Christ, and joyful in thanksgiving. Under her maternal protection, let us continue to live with faith, hope, and charity.

Readings at Mass

First Reading

Jeremiah 38: 4-6, 8-10

The king's leading men spoke to the king. 'Let Jeremiah be put to death: he is unquestionably disheartening the remaining soldiers in the city, and all the people too, by talking like this. The fellow does not have the welfare of this people at heart so much as its ruin.' 'He is in your hands as you know,' King Zedekiah answered 'for the king is powerless against you.' So they took Jeremiah and threw him into the well of Prince Malchiah in the Court of the Guard, letting him down with ropes. There was no water in the well, only mud, and into the mud Jeremiah sank.

Ebed-melech came out from the palace and spoke to the King. 'My lord king,' he said 'these men have done a wicked thing by treating the prophet Jeremiah like this: they have thrown him into the well, where he will die.' At this the king gave Ebed-melech the Cushite the following order: 'Take three men with you from here and pull the prophet Jeremiah out of the well before he dies.'

Let us not lose sight of Jesus, who leads us in our faith and brings it to perfection: for the sake of the joy which was still in the future, he endured the cross, disregarding the shamefulness of it, and from now on has taken his place at the right of God's throne. Think of the way he stood such opposition from sinners and then you will not give up for want of courage. In the fight against sin, you have not yet had to keep fighting to the point of death.

Alleluia!


