



New Archdiocese of Brisbane Volunteer Requirements Please note, the requirements have changed and the degree of working with children and vulnerable adults is not the only criterion. For example, those in a position of trust, such as Readers and Communion Ministers, and other ministries (Altar Server Coordinator, Altar Servers (over 18 years), Children's Liturgy Coordinator & Leader, Choir/Music Coordinator, Council Members, Groundsman/Gardener, Organists/ Musicians with keys, RCIA Leader, Sacramental Preparation/Program Coordinators, Sacristan, Piety Store Convenor, and all those doing Pastoral Care Ministry) must now obtain a Blue Card and Police Check. Cleaner with keys and Counters need to have Police Check. For our parish - all 4 churches:

- All Volunteers need to be registered
- Blue Card and Police Check for certain roles
- Induction must be undertaken in ministry role and approval by Parish Priest before commencement on roster (some roles are by appointment by the Parish Priest only)
- Already hold a Blue Card, or Police Check you will need to provide us with copies and have Blue Card linked
- Safeguarding Training mandatory for all volunteers

What we learn from darkness

Up during the night for some reason? Jeannie found herself loathing the darkness with a newborn's erratic need to sleep and eat which did not coincide with hers, read on for her storyThen something unexpected, something graced happened. The night feedings gave way to prayer, for me to bask in the rare silence that night afforded me; when everyone else slumbered. I had a scared space for God. As I entered that solitude hazily at first, then hungrily. It was the only time each day I could cry out my frustrations to Jesus and then be still in His soft, gentle presence. After a while, the night became my day. I had forgotten the hidden beauty of darkness and how often holiness disquises itself from the naked eve. Night, darkness, reminds me that God longs for us to pursue Him as He pursues us—relentlessly, desperately, endlessly.

Love –authentic, deep, abiding love –cannot be easily found. It must be sought, protected and fought for. It must be worth giving up our preference for security and assurance. It must be worth us changing, conforming to the One who waits for us in the stillness and silence that night provides.

I may be clothed in darkness In this stage of life, but I anticipate the dawn. Life cycles through moments of concealment to revelation and back again. Whether we operate as early birds or night owls, God meets us and transforms us when all of our time-days and nights-becomes offerings of love for him.
