

32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year B) 11th November 2018

Dear Parishioners.

This Sunday is Remembrance Sunday. 100 years ago today, at 11am on 11th November 1918 the guns on the Western Front fell silent after more than four years of continuous warfare. The allied armies had driven the German invaders back, having inflicted heavy defeats upon them over the preceding four months. In November the Germans called for an armistice (suspension of fighting) in order to secure a peace settlement. They accepted allied terms that amounted to unconditional surrender.

The 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month attained a special significance in the post-war years. The moment when hostilities ceased on the Western Front became universally associated with the remembrance of those who had died in the war.

Remembrance Sunday calls us to do three things:

- First, to give thanks for all those men and women who have laid down their lives in various conflicts, so that we may enjoy peace and se-
- Secondly, to pray for peace with justice in our own time:

And thirdly – and this is a special call to us as Catholics – to pray for those who have died in war, often in terrible and violent circumstances and quite likely far from fully prepared to meet their Maker. This is fitting for us as November is the month where we pray for the holy souls.

To give thanks for those who have fallen in the two World Wars and in subsequent conflicts - and to give thanks also for those now serving in the Armed Forces - comes to us quite naturally, above all at this time of the year.

November Masses

These are offered for the living and the dead, our deceased relatives, friends and benefactors, and for those other deceased in need of God's mercy.

In November, the month of the Holy Souls, we especially pray for the Faithful departed. You can find the November envelopes at the entrance of the church or on the pews. The recommended minimum stipend for one November Mass (by Archdiocesan law) is \$20.

Please put the names of the deceased you wish to be remembered on the envelopes provided and place them in either Sunday collection.

2 Minute Catechism Why have a Mass for a Deceased Loved One?

When a Mass is said for the soul of a deceased loved one. does this help lessen the soul's time in purgatory?

Just as we pray for others here on earth, we are encouraged by the Church to pray for souls who may be purgatory. Why? We are all in need of grace to come into the perfection of charity. We cannot enter heaven if we have not been completely cleansed of sin and all punishment due to sin. Since the Mass is the "source and summit" of the Christian Life, we naturally look to that Holy Sacrifice of Christ, containing the prefect prayer, to offer for our deceased relatives and friends who may still need the help of our prayers. Priest are under strict obligation to remember in a special way the person for whom the Mass is being offered. Often you will hear the priests say the name of the person in the part of the Mass which specifically remembers those who have gone before us. Sometimes the intention for the Mass is listed in the bulletin or announced before the Mass.

We can't really speak of "time" since the deceased person has entered eternity, but we can speak in terms of "final purification" before entrance into heaven. We believe that a Mass offered for a departed relative or friend may help hasten that final purification which he/she may still be undergoing in purgatory. So yes, a Mass does help lessen the soul's time in purgatory.

And since the Mass truly is the Sacrifice of Jesus on the Cross, it is the most perfect prayer and sacrifice. As such, nothing more glorious that we can offer to God on behalf of souls.

How exactly can I have a Mass said for the repose of the soul of a friend or relative?

Ask a priest to offer a Mass for the intention of the repose of the soul of your friend or relative.
