Dear Parishioners,

This year St Ita's Primary School celebrates its Centennial Year - 100 years of education. The theme for this year is 'Be faithful to our past, present and future'. 'Be Faithful' is one of the school's Gospel values, and it requires the school to be faithful by following the teachings of Jesus, by praying and by giving thanks to God.

St Ita's school overlooks the banks of Brisbane River, and was founded in 1919 by the Ursuline Sisters. "In 1916 Archbishop Duhig purchased Borva House, a home that stood on six acres and faced the Brisbane River at Dutton Park. At a cost of 3000 pounds it was intended that the site be developed with a church, a school and a convent. On December 16, 1917 the first mass was celebrated in a room of Borva House.

In 1918, Archbishop Duhig invited the Ursuline Sisters based in Armidale, to establish a convent in Brisbane. The Archbishop purchased another block of land overlooking Borva House. This house had belonged to Mr Edward Hughes, a local dentist and the Archbishop worked hard to ensure that the Ursuline Sisters were installed in their new convent and that they were ready to open their new school in Borva House at the start of the 1919 school year. The current hall was built in 1919 and was used as the Parish Church" (taken from St Ita's School website).

When the school opened on January 27, 1919, there were forty students enrolled. By April 1919 enrolments had swelled to 78, and today the school has around 350 students.

St Ita's school models itself around the Ursuline tradition of 'Serviam'. Those who walk into St Ita's experience a school that is joyful, vibrant, united and welcoming.

As this is a Centennial Year, the school has many

upcoming celebrations to acknowledge this milestone. One of the highlights will be the special Centenary mass and celebration on the 11th August.

To commemorate this Centennial Year, the School now has a new logo. The logo contains many features which celebrate its history. Here's the Principal's explanation of the logo:

- * The cross for the Ursuline sisters shaped in the way they serve others
- * The hands to remind us of the Ursuline Sisters motto 'serviam' as well as being a welcoming and inclusive community
- * The water represents the Brisbane River



* Three words 'Believe Learn Serve—the values that represent the vision of St Ita's

- * The crest from the original logo,
- * The shape of an open book, to remind us of our learning,
- * The Southern Cross reminds us of the great work the Ursuline Sisters have done in Australia.

READINGS AT MASS

Entrance Antiphon

Ps 94:6-7

O come, let us worship God and bow low before the God who made us, for he is the Lord our God.

First reading

Isaiah 6: 1-8

In the year of King Uzziah's death I saw the Lord of Hosts seated on a high throne; his train filled the sanctuary; above him stood seraphs, each one with six wings.

And they cried out to one another in this way, 'Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of Hosts. His glory fills the whole earth.'

The foundations of the threshold shook with the voice of the one who cried out, and the Temple was filled with smoke. I said:

'What a wretched state I am in! I am lost, for I am a man of unclean lips and I live among a people of unclean lips, and my eyes have looked at the King, the Lord of Hosts.'

Second reading

1 Cor 15:1-11

Brothers, I want to remind you of the gospel I preached to you, the gospel that you received and in which you are firmly established; because the gospel will save you only if you keep believing exactly what I preached to you – believing anything else will not lead to anything.

Well then, in the first place, I taught you what I had been taught myself, namely that Christ died for our sins, in accordance with the scriptures; that he was buried; and that he was raised to life on the third day, in accordance with the scriptures; that he appeared first to Cephas and secondly to the Twelve. Next he appeared to more than five hundred of the brothers at the same time, most of whom are still alive, though some have died; then he appeared to James, and then to all the apostles; and last of all he appeared to me too; it was as though I was born when no one expected it.

I am the least of the apostles; in fact, since I persecuted the Church of God, I hardly deserve the name apostle; but by God's grace that is what I am, and the grace that he gave me has not been fruitless. On the contrary, I, or rather the grace of God that is with me, have worked harder than any of the others; but what matters is that I preach what they preach, and this is what you all believed.

Gospel

Luke 5:1-11

Jesus was standing one day by the Lake of Gennesaret, with the crowd pressing round him listening to the word of God, when he caught sight of two boats close to the bank. The fishermen had gone out of the m and were washing their nets. He got into one of the boats—it was Simon's—and asked him to put out a little from the shore. Then he sat down and taught the crowds from the boat.

When he had finished speaking he said to Simon, 'Put out into deep water and pay out your nets for a catch.' 'Master,' Simon replied, 'we worked hard all night long and caught nothing, but if you say so, I will pay out the nets.' And when they had done this they netted such a huge number of fish that their nets began to tear, so they signalled to their companions in other boats to come and help them; when these came, they filled the two boats to sinking points.

When Si mon Peter saw this he fell at the knees of Jesus, saying, 'Leave me, Lord; I am a sinful man.' For he and all his companions were completely overcome by the catch they had made; so also were James and John, sons of Zebedee, who were Simon's partners. But Jesus said to Simon, 'Do not be afraid; from now on it is men you will catch.' Then, bringing their boats back to land, they left everything and followed him.

2 MINUTE CATECHISM

Q: Is there an appropriate name for our Saviour in the context of certain situations? Should we refer to him as Jesus, Christ, Jesus Christ, Christ Jesus etc.?

A: As your question suggests, exactly how we address Jesus will vary in certain contexts. Perhaps it is most important to distinguish at the outset that "Christ," is not part of Jesus proper name, but rather, it is his title. In this sense, it sometimes helps to put the definite article "the" in front of Christ, saying, "Jesus the Christ," to remind us that "Christ" is not his surname. Jesus is "the Christ," which means, "the anointed one" and translates the Hebrew word "Messiah."

His proper name, "Jesus" means, in Hebrew, "God saves." To put all of this together in English, his name and title might be rendered "Anointed Lord and Saviour."

While it is certainly fine for us to call him simply by his proper name, "Jesus," in the formal liturgy of the Church we often speak of him more fully, such as, "Christ our Lord," or "Our Lord Jesus Christ," and so forth.

All this said, it must be added that there are over 100 titles of Jesus, and ways of referring to him in the Scriptures which can also be appropriate ways of referring to him in certain circumstances. Or example he is called "Alpha and Omega, Author and Finisher of our faith, Son of David, Son of Man, Good Shepherd, Emanuel, I AM, King of Israel, the Way the Truth and the Life, Light of the World, Redeemer, Teacher, Rabbi, Son of God, Son of Mary, True Vine, and so forth. There are more than 100 other such titles.

Thus, we do well to remember that the magnificent truth of Jesus Christ, our Lord, often requires us to speak of him in many ways, pondering his glory from many different perspectives through these titles.
