Pastoral Care Update

Our Parish Pastoral Care ministry to the Families and Vulnerable Elderly during this COVID-19 Pandemic is ongoing. Thanks to all our generous and dedicated volunteers without their support we will not be able to reached-out to our needy brothers and sisters. Every week we are currently supporting more than 40 Vulnerable Elderly living alone, feeling disconnected and lonely; some homeless and families experiencing difficulties. A single phone calls, a simple act of kindness to support them in their shopping, collect and drop off medication and a hot meals cooked with love and delivered at their door steps once or twice a week means so much to each of them. They said food is always there but during this pandemic we are just so grateful for bringing us not only food supplies but a breathe of new fresh air of love, hope, care and true compassion.

Yesterday while delivering the meals, knocking from door to door one of the Elderly truly touch my heart sharing her beautiful thoughts" she said: "You and me can't be a pencil to write anyone's happiness but we can both try to be a nice eraser to remove their sadness and replace it with big SMILE." As I continue my delivery I was filled with joy deep in my heart and came to realized that the happiest people in life are the givers not the receivers. Then as I was about to drop the last set of meals I saw a homeless man walking on the street at Hardgrave road West End. I stopped and asked him where is he going and said trying to find someone who could give him a few coin to buy a meal so I offered him the last meal I had and he said, Yes of course with a smile on his face. He continued to say, "You know what? when you pray God listens, when you listens, God talks. When you believe, God works. Thank you Madam," he said, "you are God's answer to my prayers. I prayed to God to give me a few dollars to buy something to eat and you gave me a full meal for a day. God bless you Madam"....What a day filled with so many beautiful sharing of faith and blessings.

Jesus' departure and ascension into heaven was both an end and a beginning for his disciples. When the Lord Jesus departed physically from the apostles, they were not left in sorrow or grief. Instead, they were filled with joy and with areat anticipation for the coming of the Holy Spirit.

With the easing of COVID-19 restrictions we will be returning to our Mass schedule from 1st June, at St Mary's church. However, in line with the Government's social distancina auidelines, between then and Friday 12 June 2020 we are allowed a maximum of 10 people in attendance at each Mass (including myself and any ministers).

We recognise that many of you have been deeply concerned by not being able to attend Mass and would like to return as soon as possible. To ensure a fair approach to determining who can attend Mass from 1 June, we will be asking you to register. Legislation requires we have a Marshall and I have appointed Dianne Ezzy to this role.

All parishioners who would like to attend a Mass between 1 June and Friday 12 June are asked to email or call Dianne. Every Thursday we will be advising each individual which Mass they are registered for that week. Given the restrictions on numbers, some Masses may have filled up by the time you get a call and so you will have to select a Mass from the remaining available spots. Once your name

READINGS AT MASS

Entrance Antiphon Acts 1: 11

Men of Galilee, why gaze in wonder at the heavens? This Jesus whom you saw ascending into heaven will return as you saw him go, alleluia.

First reading Acts 1:1-11

In my earlier work, Theophilus, I dealt with everything Jesus had done and taught from the beginning until the day he gave his instructions to the apostles he had chosen through the Holy Spirit, and was taken up to heaven. He had shown himself alive to them after his Passion by many demonstrations: for forty days he had continued to appear to them and tell them about the kingdom of God. When he had been at table with them, he had told them not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait there for what the Father had promised. 'It is' he had said 'what you have heard me speak about: John baptised with water but you, not many days from now, will be baptised with the Holy Spirit."

Now having met together, they asked him, 'Lord, has the time come? Are you going to restore the kingdom to Israel?' He replied, 'It is not for you to know times or dates that the Father has decided by his own authority, but you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you, and then you will be my witnesses not only in Jerusalem but throughout Judaea and Samaria, and indeed to the ends of the earth.' As he said this he was lifted up while they looked on, and a cloud took him from their sight. They were still staring into the sky when suddenly two men in white were standing near them and they said, 'Why are you men from Galilee standing here looking into the sky? Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven, this same Jesus will come back in the same way as you have seen him go there.'

He has put all things under his feet and made him, as the ruler of everything, the head of the Church; which is his body, the fullness of him who fills the whole creation.

Novena To The Holy Spirit For The Seven Gifts

This Friday, 22 May we commence pravina the Novena To The Holy Spirit For The Seven Gifts. Although there

are several different versions of "Pentecost Novenas" the original Novena prayer was a Pentecost Novena.

"Novenas are an ancient tradition that goes back to the days of the Apostles.

Jesus told His disciples to pray together after His ascension into heaven, so they went to an upper room along with the Blessed Virgin Mary, (Acts 1:14) and joined constantly in prayer for nine davs.

These nine days of constant prayer by the Apostles, at the direction of Jesus, led up to Pentecost. This is when the Holy Spirit descended upon the disciples as "tongues of fire" (Acts 2:1-4). This pattern of 9 days of prayer is the basis of the novenas we pray today!

Thus, the novena is an imitation of the Lord's command to the Apostles when they prayed for 9 days in anticipation of the coming of the Holy Spirit.

And that's why we pray all of our novenas for nine days, followed by one final prayer on the 10th day (which is usually the feast day)." Ref: Praymorenovenas.com


