PENTECOST SUNDAY 31 May 2020 - Year A

Dear Brothers and Sisters

This weekend we celebrate the Pentecost Sunday, the day when the Holy Spirit descended on the disciples and the church was founded. The spirit came upon the disciples in the form of tongues of fire and transformed them into true messengers of Jesus. Once they received the Spirit, they went out boldly and preached to all in Jerusalem and elsewhere. On this day Jesus wants us to know the freedom of living in his Spirit. This feast is the culmination of the Paschal mystery where Jesus fulfils his promise of sending the Spirit of the Father and the Son on his disciples. This feast also indicates that the Holy Spirit is an on-going reality, who will be with the church forever and who will touch our lives every single day.

Pentecost means fiftieth day. It was the second of three great Jewish Feasts. For the Jews it was a day of gratitude. It was a day of thanksgiving for the completion of the harvest. However, on this day fiftieth day after the resurrection a great transformation took place in the small group of disciples. They were persons perplexed, scared, dumbfounded, and disappointed, but when they received the Holy Spirit, they all made powerful proclaimers of the aospel. The sign of the Holy Spirit is sign of power and zeal in proclaiming our faith in God by word and deed. The apostles spoke the word of God in their own dialect, to their astonishment. people those who listened to them, all understood in their own language. So another sign of Holy Spirit is sign of unity and harmony. This was the novel experience of the new harvest, Pentecost! Indeed, as St Paul tells us that no one can say, "Jesus is Lord" unless he is under the influence of the Holy Spirit.

Lord Jesus, we thank you for the gift of Pentecost and for the new life you offer in the Holy Spirit. Fill us and our families with your Holy Spirit and set our hearts ablaze with the fire of your love that we may serve you in joy and freedom.

Entrance Antiphon Wis 1: 7

The Spirit of the Lord has filled the whole world and that which contains all things understands what is said, alleluia.

First reading Acts 2:1-11

When Pentecost day came round, they had all met in one room, when suddenly they heard what sounded like a powerful wind from heaven, the noise of which filled the entire house in which they were sitting; and something appeared to them that seemed like tongues of fire; these separated and came to rest on the head of each of them. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak foreign languages as the Spirit gave them the gift of speech.

Now there were devout men living in Jerusalem from every nation under heaven, and at this sound they all assembled, each one bewildered to hear these men speaking his own language. They were amazed and astonished. 'Surely' they said 'all these men speaking are Galileans? How does it happen that each of us hears them in his own native language? Parthians, Medes and Elamites; people from Mesopotamia, Judaea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya round Cyrene; as well as visitors from Rome – Jews and proselytes alike – Cretans and Arabs; we hear them preaching in our own language about the marvels of God.'

Second reading 1 Corinthians 12:3-7,12-13

No one can say, 'Jesus is Lord' unless he is under the influence of the Holy Spirit. There is a variety of gifts but always the same Spirit; there are all sorts of service to be done, but always to the same Lord; working in all sorts of different ways in different people, it is the same God who is working in all of them. The particular way in which the Spirit is given to each person is for a good purpose. Just as a human body, though it is made up of many parts, is a single unit because all these parts, though many, make one body, so it is with Christ. In the one Spirit we were all baptised, Jews as well as Greeks, slaves as well as citizens, and one Spirit was given to us all to drink.

2 Minute Catechism

How did Pentecost get its name?

The word Pentecost means "Fiftieth" or "50" in Greek (Catechism, Glossary, p. 893). The Holy Spirit descended upon the Apostles on Pentecost - 50 days after the Lord's Resurrection. Pentecost is pronounced "pen-teck-cost."

Was there any symbolic meaning to the manifestation of the wind and the tongues of fire?

The "wind" recalls the Spirit of God moving over the waters at the creation of the world (Genesis 1:1-2). The manifestation of the Holy Spirit through the "strong, driving wind" indicates that a "new creation" is taking place: the renewal of humanity in God's Holy Spirit. The "tongues of fire" denote the Presence of God, purification, and Judgment. Traditional catechesis (i.e. training people in the Faith) saw the tongues of fire as signifying the sacredness and divine (God-given) authority of the preaching and teaching of the Apostles, by whose words, fervour, and witness, and example all people were to be converted to the knowledge, love, and service to God.

A great opportunity to spend more time to reflect and pray as St Pio of Pietrelcina said the "Holy Rosary is the great weapon for this time".
