

# **14TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME** 5 July 2020 - Year A

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

On the face of challenge one can have two options either face it with courage or run away like a coward. In the gospel of today, Jesus says Come to me, all who labour and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me; for I am gentle and lowly in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light." The yoke that Jesus gives for us does not cause discomfort but brings us comfort because the yoke of Jesus is easy and light. The invitation of Jesus to us is to accept not a yoke that weighs us down but a yoke that is easy and light. There is still another way of understanding the image of the yoke. Think of it as a double yoke, where two oxen can work together better. We now have a lovely image of Jesus and I yoked together, pulling together to spread his kingdom. Then his call to shoulder his yoke becomes a call to share his yoke with him. Where I go, he goes along with me, pulling together with me and making it all the more easier.

When Jesus says, "My burden is light and my yoke is easy," there is something very compelling and attractive about it. The Greek word which describes the voke as 'easy' has a richer connotation. It means, good, gentle, benevolent, benign, pleasant, and in fact comfortable. 'Come, you weary ones,' Jesus is saying, 'turn in your heavy burdens and wearisome yokes that lock you into despair and shackle you to anxiety. Live life my way and place your burdens on me and they will be light. Your yokes too will be gentle and in fact, pleasant if you are with Jesus

Jesus does not promise a life without burdens or weariness. On the other hand he offers a way of facing them. His is not an

#### IMPORTANCE NOTICE ABOUT MASS FROM THE ARCHDIOCESE

- All Catholics remain dispensed from their Sunday obligation until further notice.
- Communion is generally distributed by the presider alone, who should disinfect his hands before and after distributing. If necessary, Extraordinary Ministers may assist to distribute Communion and they, too must sanitise their hands before and after distributing.
- In the Ordinary Form of the Latin Rite, the Body of Christ should be administered only in the hand and the chalice should be received by the celebrant alone.
- The Sign of Peace should be limited to saying "Peace be with you" with a nod or bow; no hand-shaking or handholding should occur here or at the Our Father.
- Hymn books should not be used.
- Collection plates should not be passed from person to person
- Masses will continue to be live-streamed from the Cathedral on Sundays and weekdays and may continue to be live-streamed from parishes.
- Holy water fonts remain empty.
