Dear Brothers and Sisters,

This newsletter is no doubt just one source of information in your life. Electronic media – and the technology that conveys it – mean that each of us has limitless amounts of news and information at our fingertips. This can be a good thing; it makes it easier to do our jobs and it allows us to connect with friends and family the world over. It also has its downsides. First, if we let it, media can fill our minds with a constant stream of depressing stories; whether it be news of a mining company destroying millennia-old cultural treasures in search of profit, or the taking or mistreatment of innocent life. Second, social media allow people to find others who think the same way as them, leading to ideological "echo chambers" where people spend much of their time agreeing with each other about the supposed wrong thoughts or deeds of "others."

One thing I don't think the media has helped us with is forgiveness. And this Sunday's Gospel presents us with what might be one of Jesus' most challenging teachings on this subject. How many times must we forgive each other? "Not seven ... but seventy-seven times" (Mt 18:22). While we might be able to manage this sort of forgiveness some (or even most) of the time; eventually this teaching seems to ask too much of us. That is, until we call to mind what we are capable of, and the forgiveness we have received from God, especially in the sacrament of reconciliation. Like the servant in the Gospel, how can we not extend to others the forgiveness we receive from God? May this

week's Gospel inspire us to model God's mercy in our interactions with others, knowing that how we act speaks louder than what we say.

At this, the servant threw himself down at his master's feet. "Give me time" he said "and I will pay the whole sum." And the servant's master felt so sorry for him that he let him go and cancelled the debt. Now as this servant went out, he happened to meet a fellow servant who owed him one hundred denarii; and he seized him by the throat and began to throttle him. "Pay what you owe me" he said. His fellow servant fell at his feet and implored him, saying, "Give me time and I will pay you." But the other would not agree; on the contrary, he had him thrown into prison till he should pay the debt. His fellow servants were deeply distressed

when they saw what had happened, and they went to their master and reported the whole affair to him. Then the master sent for him. "You wicked servant," he said "I cancelled all that debt of yours when you appealed to me. Were you not bound, then, to have pity on your fellow servant just as I had pity on you?" And in his anger the master handed him over to the torturers till he should pay all his debt. And that is how my heavenly Father will deal with you unless you each forgive your brother from your heart.'

The annual collection for the support of the church in the Holy Land normally takes place on Good Friday. This year, due to the closure of churches around the world during Holy Week because of the Covid-19 Pandemic, Pope Francis moved the date for this collection to Sunday 13 September to coincide with the Feast of the Exaltation of the Cross on 14 September.

This collection promotes the missionary work of the Church in the Holy Land by providing welfare assistance to local Christians in areas such as health, education, employment and housing. Parishes, schools, orphanages and medical centres throughout the Holy Land also rely on assistance from this collection. It is also used to maintain over 70 churches and shrines associated with the life of Jesus.

Last year, Australian Catholics donated \$1.3 million to this cause, despite tough economic times, rural droughts and the increasing cost of living. This year, we are again facing great challenges due to Covid-19, but your generosity would again be greatly appreciated.

Please remember the Christians of the Holy Land this Sunday and please also keep them in your prayers. Thank you.

Pastoral Care Update


Dear Parishioners,
