Dear Brothers and Sisters,

I think it's fairly uncontroversial to say that, when we are given a choice, we quite often don't make the best decisions. The most obvious example is, of course, Adam and Eve who used their free will to disobey God by eating of the tree. We live with the aftermath of their choice to this day.

Today's Scripture readings together paint a picture of the feast that God has prepared for us. It is a feast to which He calls us insistently. Isaiah's prophecy in the first reading talks of "a banquet of rich food, a ban-quet of fine wines" (Is 25:6). At this metaphorical banquet there will be no mourning, no tears, and no shame. If we stop long enough to think, this is exact-ly how we would make the world if we had the choice; no death, no sadness, no regrets. And in to-day's Gospel reading we hear of the feast that the king gave for his son's wedding. Rather than expressing gratitude for the king's free gift, and earnestly attempting to respond to his invitation, we see that the invitees used their free wills to take different paths; "one went off to his farm, another to his business" and, remarkably, "the rest seized [the king's] servants, maltreated them and killed them" (Mt 22:5 -6). It is one thing to politely decline the king's invitation, it is quite another thing to kill the king's servants. And so we hear that "those who were invited proved to be unworthy" \dots to say the least (Mt 22:8)!

In the end we know that "the wedding hall was filled with guests"; by those who responded to the king's to God's - call (Mt 22:10). Thus, in this Gospel, we get to see the prize if we use our free wills wisely. The question that should occupy our minds this week is: if we find ourselves at the banquet, will we be wearing a wedding garment? We are called, but will we be chosen?

First reading: Isaiah 25:6-10

On this mountain,

the Lord of hosts will prepare for all peoples a banquet of rich food, a banquet of fine wines, of food rich and juicy, of fine strained wines. On this mountain he will remove the mourning veil covering all peoples, and the shroud enwrapping all nations, he will destroy Death for ever. The Lord will wipe away the tears from every cheek; he will take away his people's shame everywhere on earth, for the Lord has said so. That day, it will be said: See, this is our God in whom we hoped for salvation; the Lord is the one in whom we hoped. We exult and we rejoice that he has saved us; for the hand of the Lord rests on this mountain.

Second reading: Philippians 4:12-14,19-20

I know how to be poor and I know how to be rich too. I have been through my initiation and now I am ready for anything anywhere: full stomach or empty stomach, poverty or plenty. There is nothing I cannot master with the help of the One who gives me strength. All the same, it was good of you to share with me in my hardships. In return my God will fulfil all your needs, in Christ Jesus, as lavishly as only God can. Glory to God, our Father, for ever and ever. Amen.

Alleluia, alleluia! May the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ enlighten the eyes of our heart that we might see how great is the hope to which we are called. Alleluia!

Gospel: Matthew 22:1-14

Jesus began to speak to the chief priests and elders of the people in parables: 'The kingdom of heaven may be compared to a king who gave a feast for his son's wedding. He sent his servants to call those who had been invited, but they would not come. Next he sent some more servants. "Tell those who have been invited" he said "that I have my banquet all pre-pared, my oxen and fattened cattle have been slaughtered, everything is ready. Come to the wedding." But they were not interested: one went off to his farm, another to his business, and the rest seized his servants, maltreated them and killed them. The king was furious. He despatched his troops, de-stroyed those murderers and burnt their town. Then he said to his servants, "The wedding is ready; but as those who were invited proved to be unworthy, go to the crossroads in the town and invite everyone you can find to the wedding." So these servants went out on to the roads and collected together everyone they could find, bad and good alike; and the wedding hall was filled with guests. When the king came in to look at the guests he noticed one man who was not wear-ing a wedding garment, and said to him, "How did you get in here, my friend, without a wedding garment?" And the man was silent. Then the king said to the attendants, "Bind him hand and foot and throw him out into the dark, where there will be weeping and grinding of teeth." For many are called, but few are chosen.

TWO MINUTES CATECHISM

ST LUKE Feast Day: 18 October

St. Luke was one of the four evangelists. A Gentile from Antioch in Syria, St. Paul calls him "the beloved physician" (Col. 4:14), indicating his previous occupation. As a writer, he composed the third Gospel, which provides the most extensive and thorough biography of Our Lord, as well as the book of Acts, an account of the early apostolic labors, especially those of Peter and Paul.

Between these two volumes, he wrote more of the New Testament than any other author, with St. Paul writing the second most. St. Luke is often considered the founder of Christian iconography and depicted painting images of the Blessed Mother. The Church celebrates the feast of St. Luke the Evangelist on October 18.

What is the primary purpose of the writings in the Gospel of Luke?

In his writing, St. Luke shows how the salvation promised to Israel was accomplished by Jesus and extended to the Gentiles. As a careful historian, Luke sets the scene of Jesus' birth in its political context by mentioning various rulers and places at the time. He presents a comprehensive and articulate understanding of the overall life of Jesus from His birth to His Resurrection. The overall tone of the Gospel of Luke was inviting and encouraging, as he wrote for the non-Jews of the day to understand that Jesus had not only come for the salvation of the Jews but that salvation was extended to the Gentiles and to everyone.

In what language was the Gospel of Luke written?

The common language of the Mediterranean region in Luke's day was Greek, and thus St. Luke wrote his Gospel and the Acts in Greek. When citing the Jewish Scriptures, he quotes the Septuagint, which the rabbis of Alexandria in Egypt had translated from the original Hebrew for use by the Jewish diaspora in Rome, Antioch, and throughout the Mediterranean. Thus outside Judea, Greek became the first language of evangelization for both Jew and Greek, and the Septuagint the Church's first version of the Old Testament.
