THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER 14th April 2024 - Year B

My brothers and sisters,

Our Gospel today follows on from the famous story of Jesus appearing to the disciples on the road to Emmaus. Luke's account has similarities to what we heard last week with St Thomas who doubted Jesus' resurrection. Jesus invited those present to touch him and truly experience the physicality of the resurrection. So that they would live in belief and not doubt, he goes on further to eat and show his presence among them. He's not just a ghost or story but Jesus has truly risen with the marks of his crucifixion.

Earlier in Luke's Gospel when Jesus is at table with the Twelve he says, "I have eagerly desired to eat this Passover with you before I suffer; for I tell you, I will not eat it until it is fulfilled in the kingdom of God (Lk 22:15-16)."

Scholars have connected the moment of the Passover with the moment of the resurrection when Jesus eats before the apostles as a way of showing that Christ now partakes of the eternal Banquet. What was the Passover has become the Wedding Feast. Jesus shared the cup with the apostles, whilst they were entrenched in the brokenness of the world, indeed, Judas' betrayal was highlighted at the Passover, but then he eats again to fulfill his words and show that the reign of the Kingdom of God has now begun through his resurrection.

So, what does this all mean for us? The Eucharist is our contact with the eternal Banquet. We're invited every Sunday to draw closer to the resurrected Christ through the Eucharist. When we come to the table, we bring the mess of our lives, whether that be the argument we had in the car before Mass or the actions of the night/days beforehand. Every aspect of our lives join us as we approach the table.

Like the apostles, we might be agitated or filled with doubts. The Lord still invites you to see and to touch, that in our encounter with the resurrected Lord in the Eucharist, we might experience the joy, the wonder and awe that comes with having such an intimate experience of our God.

May we be witnesses to the eternal Lord by the way we delve into the Mystery of the Eucharist and truly experience this heavenly Banquet whilst here on earth.

First reading: Acts 3:13-15,17-19

Peter said to the people: 'You are Israelites, and it is the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, the God of our ancestors, who has glorified his servant Jesus, the same Jesus you handed over and then disowned in the presence of Pilate after Pilate had decided to re-lease him. It was you who accused the Holy One, the Just One, you who demanded the reprieve of a murderer while you killed the prince of life. God, however, raised him from the dead, and to that fact we are the witnesses.

'Now I know, brothers, that neither you nor your leaders had any idea what you were really doing; this was the way God carried out what he had fore-told, when he said through all his prophets that his Christ would suffer. Now you must repent and turn to God, so that your sins may be wiped out.'

The disciples told their story of what had happened on the road and how they had recognised Jesus at the breaking of bread.

They were still talking about all this when Jesus him-self stood among them and said to them, 'Peace be with you!' In a state of alarm and fright, they thought they were seeing a ghost. But he said, 'Why

are you so agitated, and why are these doubts rising in your hearts? Look at my hands and feet; yes, it is I indeed. Touch me and see for yourselves; a ghost has no flesh and bones as you can see I have.' And as he said this he showed them his hands and feet. Their joy was so great that they still could not believe it, and they stood there dumbfounded; so he said to them, 'Have you anything here to eat?' And they of-fered him a piece of grilled fish, which he took and ate before their eyes.

Then he told them, 'This is what I meant when I said, while I was still with you, that everything written about me in the Law of Moses, in the Prophets and in the Psalms has to be fulfilled.' He then opened their minds to understand the scriptures, and he said to them, 'So you see how it is written that the Christ would suffer and on the third day rise from the dead, and that, in his name, repentance for the forgiveness of sins would be preached to all the nations, begin-ning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses to this.'
