Statement of Intentions

I've been witnessing a few weddings lately, and there's a moment in the ceremony where the couple state their intentions for Marriage before the gathered. Fr Ravi and I have seemed to have found our footing, but I'd like to take the time now to state my intentions for my time here and give you a sense of what I'm thinking/dreaming.

1. One of the first things I noticed is that we have two mission statements.

St Mary's South Brisbane

'Being a Parish community with Jesus at its heart and centre, committed to worshiping God, sharing faith and serving others under the guidance of our Blessed Mother, Mary.

Dutton Park Parish

'We gather as a Catholic community to proclaim and celebrate the Gospel message. We do this by serving Christ in all those we encounter with love, faith, action, hope and joy.'

I think if any community is going to thrive, it needs to have a clear vision statement and sense of identity, hence why I think Amalgamation is important. One identity, one mission.

- 2. The school has now become the place of evangelisation, and I'd like to see a stronger connection between Parish and School. I've been intentional about getting to St Ita's and St Laurence's but there's still much to do. I hope that we can see an increase of Parishioners from the school and an increase of Parishioners going to the school.
- 3. Being an inner-city Parish I'm sensitive to the needs of the community. I was confronted by the tent city that was at Musgrave Park when I first arrived, but all to highlight the need that our area is

longing to address. I hope in some way that we as a community of believers might be in that space making a difference.

- 4. Good Liturgy means good worship and a healthy faith life. I think we do a good job in our separate communities when it comes to worship, but there's always room for improvement. I'd like to see us striving to make our Sundays and weekday liturgies true moments of encounter with God.
- 5. I mentioned earlier that we're an inner-city Parish. I think there's opportunities for us to increase our sense of community and belonging. Again, I do believe people feel at home within their Church communities, but having such transient people by way of students and visitors to the cities can easily make it feel as if this is another Church without a character of its own. I'd like to see us develop a stronger sense of community within our churches.

It's worth noting that I do hope to bring our properties up to standard as well.

But these, and many other hopes and dreams form the basis of our work in the Parish. These are but a few of my intentions. You might agree with some of them or none of them, but as we keep moving hopefully the dreams of our Parish might align to something that we can all own and cherish. Please keep our Parish in your prayers.

When Pentecost day came round, they had all met in one room, when suddenly they heard what sounded like a powerful wind from heaven, the noise of which filled the entire house in which they were sitting; and something appeared to them that seemed like tongues of fire; these separated and came to rest on the head of each of them. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak foreign languages as the Spirit gave them the gift of speech.

Now there were devout men living in Jerusalem from every nation under heaven, and at this sound they all assembled, each one bewildered to hear these men speaking his own language. They were amazed and astonished. 'Surely' they said 'all these men speaking are Galileans? How does it happen that each of us hears them in his own native language? Parthians, Medes and Elamites; people from Mesopotamia, Judaea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya round Cyrene; as well as visitors from Rome – Jews and proselytes alike – Cretans and Arabs; we hear them preaching in our own language about the marvels of God.'

Second reading: 1 Corinthians 12:3-7,12-13

No one can say, 'Jesus is Lord' unless he is under the influence of the Holy Spirit.

There is a variety of gifts but always the same Spirit; there are all sorts of service to be done, but always to the same Lord; working in all sorts of different ways in different people, it is the same God who is working in all of them. The particular way in which the Spirit is given to each person is for a good purpose.

Just as a human body, though it is made up of many parts, is a single unit because all these parts, though many, make one body, so it is with Christ. In the one Spirit we were all baptised, Jews as well as Greeks, slaves as well as citizens, and one Spirit was given to us all to drink.

Jesus said to his disciples:

'When the Advocate comes, whom I shall send to you from the Father, the Spirit of truth who issues from the Father, he will be my witness.
And you too will be witnesses, because you have been with me from the outset.

'I still have many things to say to you but they would be too much for you now. But when the Spirit of truth comes he will lead you to the complete truth, since he will not be speaking as from himself but will say only what he has learnt; and he will tell you of the things to come. He will glorify me, since all he tells you will be taken from what is mine. Everything the Father has is mine; that is why I said:
All he tells you will be taken from what is mine.'
