Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time 18th August 2024 - Year B

In John 6:51-58, Jesus says, "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever. This bread is my flesh, which I will give for the life of the world." These words are foundational to our Catholic belief in the Eucharist, where the bread and wine offered at Mass become the Body and Blood of Christ.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church (1324-1327) states that the Eucharist is "the source and summit" of Christian life. The Eucharist is often referred to as the "source and summit" of Christian life because it is from this sacrament that all other graces flow. Jesus' declaration that "whoever eats this bread will live forever" emphasises that the Eucharist is not just a symbolic act but a real and vital source of spiritual life. In receiving the Eucharist, we believe that we are receiving the true Body and Blood of Christ, which nourishes our souls and sustains our journey toward eternal life. What does the Eucharist do in our lives?

- 1. The Eucharist brings Union with Christ: When Jesus says, "Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me, and I in them," He speaks of an intimate union between Himself and the believer. In our Catholic worship, the Eucharist is the means by which this union is realised. By receiving Christ in the Eucharist, we believe that we are united with Him in a profound and transformative way. This union is not just a spiritual connection but a real, physical communion that strengthens our relationship with Christ and the Church.
- 2. The Eucharist brings Communion with the Church: The Eucharist also has a communal dimension. In partaking of the same Body and Blood of Christ, we the faithful, are united with one another in the Church, the Body of Christ. This communal aspect of the Eucharist reflects the Church's understanding of itself as a community of believers who are called to live in unity and love. The Eucharist is the sacrament that binds the Church together, nourishing the faithful and enabling us to live out our mission in the world.

The experience of the Eucharist in the lives of some saints is as follows:

- St. Thomas Aquinas says, "The Eucharist is the sacrament of love; it signifies love, it produces love."
- St. John Vianney says, "When we receive Holy Communion, we experience something extraordinary—a joy, a fragrance, a well-being that thrills the whole body and causes it to exalt."
- St. Padre Pio says, "It would be easier for the world to survive without the sun than to do without the Holy Mass."

The Eucharist is the heart of our Catholic faith and the ultimate expression of God's love for God's people. So let us receive the Eucharist with faith, love and reverence.

READINGS AT MASS

First reading: Proverbs 9:1-6

Wisdom has built herself a house, she has erected her seven pillars, she has slaughtered her beasts, prepared her wine, she has laid her table.

She has despatched her maidservants and proclaimed from the city's heights: 'Who is ignorant? Let him step this way.'

To the fool she says, 'Come and eat my bread, drink the wine I have prepared!

Leave your folly and you will live, walk in the ways of perception.'

Responsorial Psalm:

Taste and see the goodness of the Lord.

I will bless the Lord at all times, his praise always on my lips; in the lord my soul shall make its boast. The humble shall hear and be glad **R**/

Revere the Lord, you saints.
They lack nothing, those who revere him.
Strong lions suffer want and go hungry
but those who seek the Lord lack no blessing. **R/**

Come, children, and hear me that I may teach you the fear of the Lord. Who is he who longs for life And many days, to enjoy his prosperity. **R/**

Second reading: Ephesians 5:15-20

Be very careful about the sort of lives you lead, like intelligent and not like senseless people. This may be a wicked age, but you redeem it. And do not be thoughtless but recognise what is the will of the Lord. Do not drug yourselves with wine, this is simply dissipation; be filled with the Spirit. Sing the words and tunes of the psalms and hymns when you are together, and go on singing and chanting to the Lord in your hearts, so that always and everywhere you are giving thanks to God who is our Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Alleluia, alleluia!
All who eat my flesh and drink my blood live in me and I in them, says the Lord.
Alleluia!

Gospel: John 6:51-58

Jesus said to the crowd:

'I am the living bread which has come down from heaven. Anyone who eats this bread will live for ever; and the bread that I shall give is my flesh, for the life of the world.'

Then the Jews started arguing with one another: 'How can this man give us his flesh to eat?' they said. Jesus replied: 'I tell you most solemnly,

if you do not eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood,

you will not have life in you.

Anyone who does eat my flesh and drink my blood has eternal life,

and I shall raise him up on the last day.

For my flesh is real food

and my blood is real drink.

He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood lives in me

and I live in him.

As I, who am sent by the living Father, myself draw life from the Father, so whoever eats me will draw life from me. This is the bread come down from heaven; not like the bread our ancestors ate: they are dead,

but anyone who eats this bread will live for ever.'


