Twenty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time 25th August 2024 - Year B

Friends, this is our last week with the Gospel of John in the Bread of Life discourse.

Firstly, note how this theme seems to inject itself in the liturgical calendar. We've come through the Easter season and now we're in thick of Jesus' call to 'pick up your cross and follow me (Mt 16: 24-26).' Rightly so, as Mother Church would have it, the strength, nourishment and disposition to be able to pick up your cross in the first place is sustained by the Eucharist - the Bread of Life. Put in another way, the Church is providing us with scriptural food for the journey as we consume physically and 'walk humbly with our God (Micah 6:8)'.

As we go through our pilgrimage toward God, we're sustained by this heavenly food, but we're also present-ed with an important question. Our first reading puts it like this "If you will not serve the Lord, choose today whom you wish to serve." Our Gospel, on the other hand, says "what about you, do you want to go away too?" Both readings seem to ask, do you believe? Are you going to follow this? What is your response?

Faith naturally raises these questions to the surface with buoyancy because the reality is that when all is said and done, we have to make a decision. Yes or No? Am I in or out? What is your response to Jesus' body and blood given to us in the Eucharist? Although many might live in indecisiveness, sitting on the fence is not of God.

Whether you like it or not, we've already made our decisions. The degree or extent of our decision is seen expressly in the way we simply show up to Mass. I bring no judgement to the person that comes twice a year, but our actions reflect our choices. What then is your response?

I appreciate that we live in a world of competing priorities. Even in my own line of work, I've seen the result of prioritising one thing over the other. In all things, my hope is that these decisions are made with Christ in mind, lest I become a 'noisy gong, clanging cymbal (1 Cor 13:1)'. My point here is that intellectual assent to Jesus' body, blood, soul and divinity in the Eucharist is not enough, but rather, our intellectual assent, and our participation in this union with regularity expresses our response.

I pray our decision to the question posed earlier is, 'Yes, I'm in! Yes, Lord, I believe!' It's from this place of belief and practice that we say, 'Amen' when we come forward to receive the Eucharist. Amen, I believe, Amen, I consume, Amen, I will live it out. It is not the minister of communion, or the priest, that we say Amen to, but it's to Christ that we proclaim Amen.

We will return to Mark's Gospel next week, but before we do, let's hold in our hearts and minds a sensitivity towards the Eucharist. I pray that our firm belief is matched by our regular participation, that in receiving the Lord, we may strain forward in this life with Christ who walks beside us, within us and before us.

First reading: Joshua 24:1-2,15-18

Joshua gathered all the tribes of Israel together at Shechem; then he called the elders, leaders, judges and scribes of Israel, and they presented themselves before God. Then Joshua said to all the people, 'If you will not serve the Lord, choose today whom you wish to serve, whether the gods that your ancestors served beyond the River, or the gods of the Amorites in whose land you are now living. As for me and my House, we will serve the Lord.'

The people answered, 'We have no intention of deserting the Lord and serving other gods! Was it not the Lord our God who brought us and our ancestors out of the land of Egypt, the house of slavery, who worked those great wonders before our eyes and preserved us all along the way we travelled and among all the peoples through whom we journeyed? What is more, the Lord drove all those peoples out before us, as well as the Amorites who used to live in this country. We too will serve the Lord, for he is our God.'

Responsorial Psalm:

Taste and see the goodness of the Lord.

Second reading: Ephesians 5:21-32

Give way to one another in obedience to Christ. Wives should regard their husbands as they regard the Lord, since as Christ is head of the Church and saves the whole body, so is a husband the head of his wife; and as the Church submits to Christ, so should wives to their husbands, in everything. Husbands should love their wives just as Christ loved the Church and sacrificed himself for her to make her holy. He made her clean by washing her in water with a form of words, so that when he took her to himself she would be glorious, with no speck or wrin-kle or anything like that, but holy and faultless. In the same way, husbands must love their wives as they love their own bodies; for a man to love his wife is for him to love himself. A man never hates his own body, but he feeds it and looks after it; and that is the way Christ treats the Church, because it is his body - and we are its living parts. For this reason, a man must leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two will become one body. This

mystery has many implications; but I am saying it applies to Christ and the Church.

Gospel: John 6:60-69

After hearing his doctrine many of the followers of Jesus said, 'This is intolerable language. How could anyone accept it?' Jesus was aware that his followers were complaining about it and said, 'Does this upset you? What if you should see the Son of Man ascend to where he was before?

'It is the spirit that gives life,

the flesh has nothing to offer.

The words I have spoken to you are spirit and they are life.

'But there are some of you who do not believe.'

For Jesus knew from the outset those who did not believe, and who it was that would betray him. He went on, 'This is why I told you that no one could come to me unless the Father allows him.' After this, many of his disciples left him and stopped going with him.

Then Jesus said to the Twelve, 'What about you, do you want to go away too?' Simon Peter answered, 'Lord, who shall we go to? You have the message of eternal life, and we believe; we know that you are the Holy One of God.'
