Twenty-Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time 15th September 2024 - Year B

In James 2:14-18, we are reminded of a profound truth: faith without works is dead. James challenges us to move beyond mere words or beliefs and to live out our faith through action. James is asking us to think deeply about the kind of faith we have. Is our faith alive and active, or is it a set of beliefs without any real impact on our lives or the lives of others? True faith, as James explains, is more than words; it's demonstrated through our actions.

It's easy to say we believe in God, but do our lives reflect that belief? Our faith should drive us to care for others, to love, and to act justly. If we see someone in need but do nothing, James asks, what good is our faith?

Think of the Good Samaritan in Jesus' parable (Luke 10:25-37). The priest and Levite passed by the injured man, offering no help despite their religious status. It was the Samaritan, who acted with compassion, that showed what true love and faith look like in action.

Therefore, Faith must be accompanied by deeds. James isn't saying that works alone can save us. Rather, he emphasizes that our deeds are the fruit of our faith. If we genuinely believe in God's love, mercy, and justice, our lives will reflect that belief by how we treat others. We are called to love our neighbour, to care for the poor, the marginalized, and those in need. This is what it means to live a faith that is alive and active.

Think about St. Mary Mackillop's compassion, humility, and tireless efforts to ensure that the poorest children received an education. She lived by a motto, 'Never see a need without doing something about it,'. Mother Teresa, whose faith in Christ led her to serve the poorest of the poor. Her faith wasn't just something she kept to herself; it was evident in the way she cared for the sick, the dying, and the abandoned. She lived out her faith through her actions, showing that love for God is inseparable from love for others.

James also reminds us of that faith in action doesn't always have to be grand. Sometimes, it's in the small, everyday acts of kindness that we live out our faith. A kind word, a meal shared with someone in need, standing up for someone who is being mistreated—these are ways we can put our faith into practice.

First reading: Isaiah 50:5-9

The Lord has opened my ear. For my part, I made no resistance, neither did I turn away. I offered my back to those who struck me, my cheeks to those who tore at my beard; I did not cover my face against insult and spittle. The Lord comes to my help, so that I am untouched by the insults. So, too, I set my face like flint; I know I shall not be shamed. My vindicator is here at hand. Does anyone start proceedings against me? Then let us go to court together. Who thinks he has a case against me? Let him approach me. The Lord is coming to my help, who will dare to condemn me?

I will walk in the presence of the Lord in the land of the living.

I love the Lord for he has heard the cry of my appeal; for he has turned his ear to me in the day when I called him **R/**

They surrounded me, the snares of death, with the anguish of the tomb; they caught me, sorrow and distress. I called on the Lord's name. O lord my God, deliver me! **R/**

Second reading: James 2:14-18

Take the case, my brothers, of someone who has never done a single good act but claims that he has faith. Will that faith save him? If one of the brothers or one of the sisters is in need of clothes and has not enough food to live on, and one of you says to them, 'I wish you well; keep yourself warm and eat plenty', without giving them these bare necessities of life, then what good is that? Faith is like that: if good works do not go with it, it is quite dead.

This is the way to talk to people of that kind: You say you have faith and I have good deeds; I will prove to you that I have faith by showing you my good deeds – now you prove to me that you have faith without any good deeds to show.'

Gospel Acclamation:

Gospel: Mark 8:27-35

Jesus and his disciples left for the villages round Caesarea Philippi. On the way he put this question to his disciples, 'Who do people say I am?' And they told him. 'John the Baptist,' they said 'others Elijah; others again, one of the prophets.' 'But you,' he asked 'who do you say I am?' Peter spoke up and said to him, 'You are the Christ.' And he gave them strict orders not to tell anyone about him.

And he began to teach them that the Son of Man was destined to suffer grievously, to be rejected by the elders and the chief priests and the scribes, and to be put to death, and after three days to rise again; and he said all this quite openly. Then, taking him aside, Peter started to remonstrate with him. But, turning and seeing his disciples, he rebuked Peter and said to him, 'Get behind me, Satan! Because the way you think is not God's way but man's.'

He called the people and his disciples to him and said, 'If anyone wants to be a follower of mine, let him renounce himself and take up his cross and follow me. For anyone who wants to save his life will lose it; but anyone who loses his life for my sake, and for the sake of the gospel, will save it.'

SYOND24

Last week, 150 voices from around the Archdiocese of Brisbane, including our very own Fr William and Edith Pidgeon, gathered at the Holy Spirit Seminary for the first sitting of the SYNOD24. Every action examined at the synod cleared the two-thirds majority required for the endorsement, with one action rewritten with broader language before it was ultimately endorsed. These actions spanned the topics like mission in the digital environment, how the power of the governance should be supported by the laity, dialoguing with survivors of sexual abuse and reconciliation. One participant said, "I didn't know what to expect going into this... but it was edifying to experience the voting process and perhaps even more than that, the conversations in the Spirit, listening deeply to people at the table, cultivating a sense of belonging and identity in the group."

The synod will reconvene in October for another twoday session to examine other decrees of the plenary council. Let us keep the Synod process and all participants in our prayers.


