SYNOD 2024 REFLECTION

Last week, I asked Edith Pidgeon to share her reflections on the Archdiocesan Synod. I'd like to follow her input with some further reflections of my own.

We know that the Church universally is having a Synod on Synodality, exploring ways in which the Church could be more consultative, transparent and accountable. This in part is a response to the abuse scandal that has rocked the Church.

This diocesan Synod differs predominately on content, yet the Synodal approach has been employed. So, rather than talking about Synodality, we used the Synodal approach but talked about things we'd like to see happening within our diocese. Our guiding question for this local Synod was how can we be a more co-responsible Church on mission?

Naturally, the groups we consider to be on the peripheries were named, since a Church on mission goes out to the peripheries. These peripheries, form in part, the hot topics of our current society, groups like LQGBTI+, Indigenous People, Abuse Victims, Refugees, Disabled, the Elderly and vulnerable.

Now perhaps we already see ministries reaching out to these groups within the diocese, so part of this Synod was raising awareness, but also, having spent some time reflecting on the process, one of the main fruits that has emerged for me was the collaborative process of the Synod. I sat at table with people that I had never met before, I heard about their experience of the Church in Brisbane and listened to ways in which they approached mission. It was enriching and exciting to hear about their endeavours but also to imagine how we might collaborate in the future.

There are already plenty of ministries active within the diocese doing good things for people at a local level. We'd do well to inform ourselves of the good works of the Church.

Like the man of our Gospel today, Bartimaeus, calling out to Jesus, there are many people within our local area calling out for healing – 'Son of David, Jesus, have pity on me.' The missionary disciple is one who walks out in confidence knowing that there is work to be done, but that it's not done alone. Not only do we have the Holy Spirit walking beside us, but we also have each other. This indeed is what it means to be Synodal, that we walk together, side-byside. May we continue to pray for our Church both locally and universally, that we might truly be a Church on fire for Christ and the mission laid before us.

First reading: Jeremiah 31:7-9

The Lord says this: Shout with joy for Jacob! Hail the chief of nations! Proclaim! Praise! Shout: 'The Lord has saved his people, the remnant of Israel! See, I will bring them back from the land of the North and gather them from the far ends of earth; all of them: the blind and the lame, women with child, women in labour: a great company returning here. They had left in tears, I will comfort them as I lead them back; I will guide them to streams of water, by a smooth path where they will not stumble. For I am a father to Israel, and Ephraim is my first-born son.

Second reading: Hebrews 5:1-6

Every high priest has been taken out of mankind and is appointed to act for men in their relations with God, to offer gifts and sacrifices for sins; and so he can sympathise with those who are ignorant or uncertain because he too lives in the limitations of weakness. That is why he has to make sin offerings for himself as well as for the people. No one takes this honour on himself, but each one is called by God, as Aaron was. Nor did Christ give himself the glory of becoming high priest, but he had it from the one who said to him: You are my son, today I have become your father, and in another text: You are a priest of the order of Melchizedek, and for ever.

Gospel Acclamation:

Gospel: Mark 10:46-52

As Jesus left Jericho with his disciples and a large crowd, Bartimaeus (that is, the son of Timaeus), a blind beggar, was sitting at the side of the road. When he heard that it was Jesus of Nazareth, he began to shout and to say, 'Son of David, Jesus, have pity on me.' And many of them scolded him and told him to keep quiet, but he only shouted all the louder, 'Son of David, have pity on me.' Jesus stopped and said, 'Call him here.' So they called the blind man. 'Courage,' they said 'get up; he is calling you.' So throwing off his cloak, he jumped up and went to Jesus. Then Jesus spoke, 'What do you want me to do for you?' 'Rabbuni,' the blind man said to him 'Master, let me see again.' Jesus said to him, 'Go; your faith has saved you.' And immediately his sight returned and he followed him along the road.


